Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Messiah.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Through history people continue to ask who is Jesus, and a wide variety of answers are offered. Other religions may accept that Jesus lived and was a great spiritual leader who challenged the religions of

His time. For some that makes Him a prophet, for others that makes Him an activist to improve the social attitudes to be more compassionate and less judgmental. For some He is a high-ranking spiritual man of inner knowledge and insight.

Jesus did not spend his breath saying that He wasn't any of these things; because in the manner of other religions who honor these types of people, he should be included among them. What is most important is the next step, besides these things, who is He? Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Peter said correctly, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." We are Christian, when we embrace and believe the revelation that comes to us through the Holy Spirit, that Jesus is the Son of God, the Messiah. He is the promised one who restores all humanity and creation to its original innocence and perfection.

We admire and are deeply inspired by creation, but we do not worship any created being or thing, for we worship the Creator. We admire as a gift of God what we can co-create with what God has given us as talents and gifts. Knowledge can be to do good or evil. These gifts to not make us God, nor are we in competition with God.

With all of our knowledge, inventions, insights and books of wisdom and learning, we cannot come to the same level of knowledge as God has shared with us through the Holy Spirit. The message that Jesus has given to the Apostles to teach us, is a message that lifts us higher than our own loftiest concepts of life. Christianity is the insertion of light into darkness, the yeast into bread, the way, the truth, and the life.

This is not to say our own common sense and studies into the ways of the world are not profound and inspiring, but they are not the fullness of what comes to us from heaven.

As humans we each see things uniquely, see and observe life in an infinite variety of ways. This can be good in that we continue to evolve in ever-deeper ways of understanding. This can also be harmful, when what is taught, or believed is false and is based on the distortions of how we judge and mistakenly believe to be true, or know is false but use it to control others.

With Peter holding the keys, symbol of authority, and a symbol of protecting what is valuable we can know what to believe is true in those areas of belief that are crucial. It is meant to bring clarity in the situations of confusion.

Even during the short time that Jesus walked the earth, Jesus took His time carefully revealing Who He is and what to believe, and how to spread this message. This is the reality of life and it usually is a gradual journey of faith. This is important to remember in understanding the Church's teachings that are necessary to believe in order to be saved. Each generation, of believers should be discovering the deeper understanding of what it means to be a Christian from one century to the next.

The Church is a hospital's waiting room, where we the wounded come for treatment. The more we know the Scriptures and Christ the more the treatment improves to heal our spirit and body. The ministry of Peter, is to help us spend less time fighting over the treatments, and focus on the one that redeems and frees, and brings peace and truth.

It would be wonderful if every church leader personally lived fully the Gospel, but it is not the case. Unfortunately this fact proves to be a disaster for the church. As imperfect as the Apostles were, Jesus never abandoned them, and with the renewed power of the Holy Spirit, they became what they never could have without this Spirit. They were able to proclaim the beliefs with courage throughout the known lands bringing many to salvation and that same belief that Peter spoke of as well as Paul. They gave to the world the perfect worship, the perfect spiritual food; Jesus Himself. **Aboona**
