### Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, “Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon.” But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, “Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us.” He answered, “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.” But she came and knelt before him, saying, “Lord, help me.” Jesus answered, “It is not fair to take the children’s food and throw it to the dogs.” She said, “Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters’ table.” Then Jesus answered her, “Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.” And her daughter was healed instantly.

### Dear Parishioners and Friends:

There are some studies on human behavior that suggest that humans, as part of a survival mechanism through evolution, believe that it is a primal trait to have prejudicial predispositions toward people we perceive as not quite like us. The dialogue that Jesus has with this woman presents the real world dynamics of a person of one culture and religion relating to someone who belongs to a different religion and culture.

It is by instinct that we have the trait to notice differences. Through observing our family and what we learn in our

cultural environment we learn our responses to these differences. We might become comfortable or intimidated by these differences. In this case Jesus, acknowledged the difference, and in the end cast evil, and worked a miracle.

This reminds me of a father that was so proud of his son when he did not use the racial difference to describe someone he knew even though it would have made it much easier to know which friend he was to supposed to spot at the airport.

Actually, the son of course knew and was aware of his friend’s race, but had learned it wasn’t proper to “notice”. Actually, it is impossible to not notice. We are not asked to be blind; we are called to not use it as criteria for rejection and a message that can influence others to actions of evil and harm. A perfect example is the shooting in Ferguson, MO.

The world is not changed by not noticing, but by having a compassionate, consistent, and fair response with an accurate knowledge concerning what we observe and will do. Ignorance leaves the door open for much harm to be fostered in society.

Jesus in the story of the woman did not pretend or shy away from attitudes between the Canaanites and Jews. He even used the cultural bantering common between different ethnic groups. The honest recognition of each one of them did not stop them from the journey of salvation and healing.

Jesus wasted no time in theological discussions of the exact criteria of “tormented by a demon” or who are dogs, and what can be done with crumbs.

There was an internal message to hear and to listen to. For the woman, it is, “I love my daughter and something horrible is going on in her life. Nothing will stop me from seeking someone I believe can help her.” There are no barriers between those who act out of love for others. Their openness led to a miracle.

In the inner language of Jesus, He listens and speaks in the manner that we hear the world’s tensions and frictions. The inner message is, “the love I have for you transcends all evil, it conquers evil, the horrible things of this world is no match for the healing power I bring to this world that I created.”

Faith is doing the good that you would never do if you didn’t have faith. In this way, supernatural crumbs provide a feast beyond what any earthly feast can provide. The success of God’s redemptive love is all-powerful even in the midst of our failure and disbelief. The moment we began to let Him into our heart the victory begins.

Our culture increasingly neglects a dialogue with God. It reflects bewilderment and fear like lost sheep. Our ignorance of sheep allows us to think they are totally passive and easy to handle. Actually, sheep can be mean and aggressive. This does not mean they have the ability to make smart decisions or avoid dangerous situations and avoid immoral behavior. We are failing in realizing this. All actions matter, whether good or bad.

We can wander so far away from the altar table, that we are not even close enough to even see the healing crumbs or even hear the voice of the Shepherd. It was the desire of Jesus to conquer the evil turmoil. Everyone everywhere benefits from the decisions of those who approach Jesus and choose to step beyond the limitations of hatred and embrace Jesus who conquers the world’s turmoil.
