

# Christ has Risen!

#### Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him.

But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

# He truly has Risen!

#### **Dear Parishioners and Friends:**

Faith is a gift from God, finding an empty tomb does not prove Jesus was raised from the dead. The first impulse was that someone stole the body. In a variety ways, with different details presented in each of the four Gospels, each drew the same conclusion; His body was not stolen. He was alive and was appearing to many of those who were His followers. It never entered their minds to get together, and come up with a story to convince others that He was now Alive. This is the reality of life, each of us has their own story of how they heard about Jesus, and each has their unique experience to tell how they became convinced that Jesus is the Son of God, risen from the dead.

There are millions who still need to hear about Jesus the Living God and Redeemer of humanity. There are billions who still need to have the experience of personally believing in Him as the promised Messiah

The stone did not have to be rolled away for Jesus to escape from the tomb. He now has a glorified body; nothing material can stand in his way. It is rolled away so we can be aware of the power to remove the heavy obstacles in life that overcome the emptiness, so prevalent in our world. We need to come out of our darkness and discover the fullness of Life found in the Risen Lord. It is important that we are able to go into the tomb, not necessarily the tomb He was buried in, but into our own emptiness. We then discover that we too, are dependent on the power of God to be raised up, and completed through His loving grace and mercy.

Christianity believes that we need a compassionate form of transformation to live eternally with God. We believe we can be restored to exist in peace, and embraced by an all-consuming love.

We don't need proofs that people die, hurt, grieve, and struggle with pain, disappointment, and can be devastated by betrayal. The fact that we can imagine a more perfect world to live in is innate because a perfect world was created for us and our spirit hungers and searches for this place.

Jesus the Son of God entered our world to experience it the way a human experiences life. He can carry our burdens, forgive our sins, and restore our broken lives. The first to experience this is the thief that confessed Him on the cross who then entered Paradise to be with Jesus. The thief who wanted to judge others rather than his self, wouldn't even look at the path to Paradise. The thief who knew he was wrong in the choices he made asked to walk the way of redemption with Jesus.

Jesus knows His message changes the way we exist. In the miracles that He worked, He healed the broken bodies and hearts of whomever He touched. Our bodies can do wondrous things in self-healing and with medicines, but ultimately there comes a time and situation where the body and science can do no more, and to live again comes through Jesus.

The ultimate power is the power that Christ has over death. The Good News is that we don't forever have to suffer the consequences of our actions if we turn away from the wrongs that we do. The power of God's love is that we change our responses to the world that we live in. When the soldiers were arresting Jesus, Peter used his sword to defend Jesus, in doing so; he cut the soldier's ear off. Jesus told Peter, that those who live by the sword die by the sword and then healed the soldier.

In the dramatic events leading to the crucifixion, and resurrection, choices were made to act in fear or faith, make decisions to not follow based on the deeds of followers. Times have not changed. Jesus heals, transforms, forgives, challenges, teaches, rescues, and finally brings us into His safe and protected Kingdom. Our creator still lives!
