Matthew 24:23-31

"If anyone says to you, 'Look! Here is the Messiah!' or 'There he is!' — do not believe it. For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and produce great signs and omens, to lead astray, if possible, even the elect. Take note, I have told you beforehand. So, if they say to you, 'Look! He is in the wilderness,' do not go out. If they say, 'Look! He is in the inner rooms,' do not believe it.

For as the lightning comes from the east and flashes as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Wherever the corpse is, there the vultures will gather. "Immediately after the suffering of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven will be shaken. Then the sign of the Son of Man will appear in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see 'the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven' with power and great glory.

And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

I find today's Gospel has many far-reaching ramifications. On one hand there is always a religious group believing the world is going to end soon, and for all 2,000 years each time they were wrong. On the other hand every Liturgy mentions His return and the Bible gives us the signs to watch for and to be on guard.

There are a wide variety of calamities and disasters that regardless of beliefs we contemplate whether or not this is the end of the world. The point is, we need to be ready. Not obsessed with fear but being ready in the manner in which we want to be ready for any meaningful event that is significant to us. Life is getting ready for something, from being ready to be born to being ready to die.

Jesus has to respond to the preoccupation of others for when He will return, but when all is said and done, the real point is that we are following faithfully and are numbered among the elect.

Jesus makes it clear that there are false teachings, we can be lead astray, and He does return to take those who remained faithful. There is no permission to act spiritually neglectful and morally decadent

ready to throw a type of party that would never be allowed if the parents were home.

We all play the role of a false Messiah when we demote Jesus to just a man who gave information on being nice. Jesus never asked us to accept Him just because He was nice and said a few nice things. He convinced His chosen that He was far more than that. He is the Son of God that came down from heaven to be the son of Man.

We are acutely aware that churches are being closed. In America churches are being closed because so many are abandoning the Apostolic Faith and in other countries, it is due to persecution. The false Messiah is the voice that says the weeds are just as nutritious as the wheat. Where is the fertile ground for vocations and growth?

A false Messiah – a spiritual leader teaching what is false can be remarkably entertaining inspirational, with the charisma to energize crowds, but it still remains false. Sometimes what is true is not presented in a manner that inspires. In the life of faith no one takes the test for you. We must be able to tell what is true, not by the excitement and emotions, but by what brings peace reconciliation.

This generation is so steeped in self-gratification that far too many, regardless of how addictive and destructive it is to our body, our spirit, or family, and our society we pick self-gratification over a personal relationship with Jesus. We have made mistakes, and gave messages that were only met to please the ears of the listener rather the truth of the Gospel; become this served as an exit ramp from the faith rather than spreading the faith. What was believable for centuries is now ignored. What was never acceptable is now desired, and what was believed as necessary for salvation is judged as unnecessary.
