Matthew 24:1-14

As Jesus came out of the temple and was going away, his disciples came to point out to him the buildings of the temple. Then he asked them, "You see all these, do you not? Truly I tell you, not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?"

Jesus answered them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Messiah!' and they will lead many astray.

And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you are not alarmed; for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places: all this is but the beginning of the birth pangs. Then they will hand you over to be tortured and will put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of my name."

"Then many will fall away, and they will betray

one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because of the increase of lawlessness, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this good news of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the world, as a testimony to all the nations; and then the end will come."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Jesus knew it would only be natural for us to think the end of the world was soon when events that scare us are present. Natural and man-made disasters do make us wonder if the return of the Lord is almost here. Because of this, He told His followers to not use these events to scare us into believing. He also knew that there would be leaders claiming to have figured out the time of His return and claim to be prophets of the end of the world within our lifetime.

You may have watched TV evangelists quoting Scripture and headlines doing this very thing. I wish there was a way to see how many hundreds of thousands, and for some millions, they have in trusts for their grandchildren and their retirement. I am

inclined to believe that they are planning financially an inheritance for their descendents with the money they received from those they convinced there is no next generation.

Jesus is encouraging us to endure our trials. I feel uncomfortable to think He needs to tell me that to be saved, I have to endure. I wish that being saved meant you no longer had to endure any hardships. We often need a reminder of His grace, mercy and forgiveness to help us along the journey. Even though it is not the will of the Father for anyone to not endure, we do have the free will to choose actions that will cause us to lose the race to eternal life.

In some manner or another the world does come to an end. Death comes to all. For some it will be famines and earthquakes. For others it will be war and strife, but usually it will be an illness. There is also the inner war within our heart and mind; we can have famines within our spirit and emotions.

His followers pointed out the Temple as a sign of the accomplishments of the faith of their forefathers. Jesus had to remind them that they were looking at a snap shot of faith. Living faith can keep the temple, but there are situations where the temple can be lost at the hands of others, such as the "death" of the faith of those who were meant to inherit the temple. Each generation runs the chance of not inheriting the temples of their parents' faith. When we cease to be the temple of the Holy Spirit, the loss of the visible temple will follow.

Are we around the temple to catch sight of Him? Are we removing the stones of the temple by the way we are living day to day? Is the Faith enduring in our lives? **Aboona**
