Isaiah 9:1-8

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils. For the yoke that burdened them, the pole on their shoulder, And the rod of their taskmaster you have smashed, as on the day of Midian. For every boot that tramped in battle, every cloak rolled in blood, will be burned as fuel for flames. For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-counselor, God-hero, Father-forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, From David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains By judgment and justice, both now and forever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this!

The Holy Gospel

The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord. And

this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

Dear Parishioners and friends,

Can anyone argue against the world's need for a **Prince of Peace?**

We are celebrating the day the light came into the world. The darkness of the world has something quite powerful to contend with, and darkness knows its days are numbered and will end in humiliation and shame. Isaiah says if you have felt Forsaken, or desolate, you are now to be called **MY Delight**, you are to rejoice like the bridegroom rejoices in his bride.

Everyone wants to feel like there is someone special in his or her life; to feel like a treasure to someone. Isaiah says you are his delight. You are a treasure, you are his in a way no one else can ever be, this is why you exist. Like a burning torch chasing away the night, the Lord will be your vindication against every sorrow. You have the new name of the chosen. No longer will you be Forsaken or desolate you shall be filled with delight.

Another prophet besides Isaiah has come preaching the coming of the Savior. Luke says in the Acts of the Apostles that God raised up David the son of Jesse to be King of the Israelites.

The Israelites found victory after victory following king David, and through David the promise has been fulfilled, the descendant of David has been born and his name is Jesus. Now all those who profess the Name of Jesus are His chosen.

We live in world where we cannot escape every situation of grief. We are not in the Garden of Eden. **Over the year some of us have tasted the fruit of immense sorrow and pain.** Some of us have made mistakes we want to be forgiven for. Some of us have made mistakes we are unwilling to face and carry deep shame or blame that is destroying us inside.

There is darkness out there; I have seen it. There are shadows of feeling forsaken out there I have experienced it. There is desolation out there; I have felt it; in your life and in my own.

Some Christians have been in "Egypt" too long, and don't know that the world has them as a slave. The Book of Acts, says God made his people great as they came up out of the land of Egypt that is when he led with an outstretched arm.

Some Christians found room at the inn, at the bar and know there is a child wrapped in swaddling clothes out in the cave, but to get to Bethlehem the house of bread you have to get up early, and stay awake.

I will show you Bethlehem, I will show you the house of Bread, its right here in the Tabernacle. Don't be afraid, the angels said. You have nothing to fear! I come to proclaim good news to you, -tidings of great joy to be shared by the whole people. The Messiah has come and he is here.

Glory to God! Peace on earth to whom his favors rest. The prayers say the prophets are stirring in their tombs soon the cross will break an opening to free them.

Let us work together to **help stamp out darkness**, to help the forsaken **find consolation** and the desolate find compassion and understanding.

I know this light that has come into the world. We have to let it reach the darkest places in our life. When you want Jesus, when you seek him. When you start your march to Zion. When you pack up and leave Egypt, when you head for the New Jerusalem, when you leave the inn for the cave of Bethlehem, when you seek the house of the Bread from heaven, a bright light can shine in the darkest hour and then you will be called a child of the light.

We thank you Lord for the gift of Pope Francis. May we once again be revived to the essence of the Gospels' truth. Aboona
