Matthew 25:31-46

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink,

I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are

members of my family, you did it to me.' Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

This is a very challenging and thought provoking teaching of Jesus. What a shock to be totally convinced you qualify to enter into the Kingdom of God, and then find out too late that you do not, and there is nothing you can do now to qualify to enter.

The Kingdom of God is a place of security and peace; those who bring fear and war cannot enter. In this life, we need to learn and accept that path that leads away from the destructive dangers of

ignorance and actions of division. We may initially feel nervous or anxious about this separation, but when we know the wisdom of the Messenger, the power of the Healer, and the love of a Savior; we will have the actions of a believer, and the ears of a sheep listening to the Shepherd's directions.

Jesus makes it clear, regardless of what we might think, when our life is filled with harsh judgments on the marginalized; we don't know the salvation message accurately enough to dwell with Him in His Kingdom. Not so much that He locks the door, but that our life is picking the wrong doors to enter. We can keep shutting the door on His family. Our heart of judgment toward others is our judgment on ourselves.

In this translation of this Gospel story, we see Jesus identifying with those who are in trouble as His own personal family. This is how Jesus expresses His intimacy with our brokenness and failures. He desires all to find healing in order to live a wholesome life. This is only possible when we desire all creation to benefit from following His teachings.

In a family there are boundaries, an awareness of what harms and what strengthens the relationships. There is not permission to mistreat, manipulate, dominate, and tear down each other. When a child misbehaves they are given time out; separated from what they like in some manner. Grace and mercy restores and the Spirit of God convinces us to strive to overcome offending behavior; to God and each other.

Sadly, in some cases, even in a family, the offense can be so grave that there has to be a permanent separation. Sometimes this is necessary for the protection of one self and others. Not every person chooses healing and reconciliation.

Jesus knows that with justice and the right behavior that reflects His message of mercy, compassion, and forgiveness; it increases the probability of the broken to choose a life that brings reconciliation. Faith with action brings hope and redemption. **Aboona.**
