Matthew 25:1-13

The kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Jesus is talking to people who are asking questions. They are concerned about the kingdom of heaven

because they are concerned about the after life. Everyone at different times and reasons wonders about what happens after death. Sometimes it might be in response to someone they love dying. It might also be considering one's own mortality. Because of these universal thoughts and questions, it is also a religious question. What is Jesus teaching about the after life?

There are some who do not believe in an after life they just decay and become part of the earth. They are gone. Some believe the body dies and becomes a part of the earth and a spirit of sorts becomes something else in some other form. Some believe that the spirit continues to keep its original identity now freed from the body. In beliefs accepting an after life there is also a belief that the good is separated from the bad. Who does the separation and how varies immensely among groups and individuals.

Jesus is talking to the people of His religious upbringing, fellow Jews. Even among the Jews there was a split between those who believed an complete resurrection from the dead, the body and the spirit, and those who did not believe there was a resurrection of the dead. By what Jesus said to

them; He identified Himself as one who does believe in the resurrection of the dead; and that through one's decisions they would enter into joyous life built on justice, peace, and intense love or absence of all that is good.

The majority of Americans have moved away form belonging to any particular organization that is specifically formed to teach, follow, learn, and worship Jesus in the manner the Apostles did. The Sacred Scriptures are the collected letters of those who were taught directly by those who walked with Jesus and believed He was the long awaited Messiah.

In this Gospel, Jesus is the Groom and the Church is His bride. In the tradition of His people, bridesmaids light candles and light the way for the bride to be led to the groom. The smart ones make sure they have with them all that is necessary to keep the lights burning until they reach the groom's home, and they meet. The foolish fail in making the right choices to make sure the light lasts until the groom joins with the bride. The foolish is focused on their own need for position. The wise is focused on the responsibilities of their calling.

Jesus believes that He is the King of this heavenly Kingdom. At the beginning of every Liturgy we sing this truth because the Divine Liturgy is where heaven meets earth. Where the groom comes to us the church, His bride, through the Scriptures and the Eucharist.

We are offered enough grace and mercy to make it to the day of light, the day we are to meet Jesus. We as members of the church, His bride, are given all the gifts necessary for our salvation. We also can make decisions that block the oil of grace He offers to us.

Christianity does not remove accountability and responsibility from what is rightfully to be expected of us. Grace is not immunity, but the forgiveness for the repentant, the healing for the sick, the compassion for the grieving, and the door to eternal life. **Aboona**
