Matthew 10:16-25

"See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; and you will be dragged before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles.

When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parent and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next; for truly I tell you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes. A disciple is not above the teacher, nor a slave above the master; it is enough for the disciple to be like the teacher, and the slave like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household!"

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Those with a shallow understanding of the Gospel would read this and say, "look what those Jews do to Christians, 'flog you in their synagogues'". This kind of mentality has caused a great deal of harm for everyone.

A few hate and fear mongers can do a lot of harm, which has happened throughout human history. Every country, every community, organization, within relationships and some families have an example of someone among them doing horrendous harm to others even their own family. Gratefully, God's love is more powerful than sin.

It is true that for a short number of years a few people of the Jewish religion flogged Christians. History shows for a very long period of time, and even now, Jews suffer at the hands of misguided people who identify themselves as belonging to the religion of Christianity but are not living the message. You can visit no country that does not have martyrs. As a Coptic priest said on the TV show "60 Minutes", we are a church of martyrs even in our own land among our own people.

Here in the United States, we don't face physical death, but we certainly are facing spiritual death.

Maybe Father or brother or sister, has not handed anyone over to death to prevent the spreading and receiving of the faith into the next generation, but certainly a culture is shaping that is efficiently closing down ehe building up of the church, there are more arguing at the dinner table to justify not building or teaching what Jesus commanded than are professing this faith.

In the early days of Christianity the Roman Empire persecuted Christians because they thought they were atheists. This was because they refused to give any recognition to their many gods. They refused to engage in activities that could be interpreted as accepting and following the Roman gods or activities that kept them from meeting for worship in the Breaking of the Bread, the Eucharist. They were called cannibals because of the belief in the true presence. They knew the teaching, but not the foundation and understanding of this core belief.

Today Christians are not killed in the sports arena, but are being overly consumed by activities that have gravely diminished the success of the command Jesus gave His Apostles. When Jesus commanded the Apostles to go out and teach all that He taught them, He wasn't referring to uninformed opinions of a few verses, but a transforming spiritual life that healed not only physically, but deep within the damaged soul. Inner and outer war was exchanged for inner and outward peace.

The popular view that human worth increasingly depends on being better at something than the other person is misguided. We are not valued by God for being the best, but being willing to do our best for His glory. When we are seeking our own glory, we can feel crushed by the need to appear better than others, and so life becomes perpetually a feeling of being weak while trying to feel strong, but often failing. Rather, the intrinsic value of being created to know, love, worship, and walk the path of the Creator presents to us tranquility and security; this is the source of wholeness and tranquility. This expression is often found in our Liturgical prayers.

Within the ministerial priesthood and those involved in other ministries there also can be a "hatred and a betrayal". Sometimes serious behavioral disorders are ignored through ignorance or negligence that later have caused tremendous harm to the others.

Regardless of our vocation in life we play a crucial role in shaping society and in making the truth of the Gospel believable or a message we reject.

Like Peter, a betrayal can provide harm to Christianity, but through the power of the Holy Spirit it is made possible to become a confessor of the faith that grows even in the face of severe persecution. When in the hands of Jesus, there is healing, compassion, and forgiveness. **Aboona**
