Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him. "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The question of who Jesus is continues to be asked. For some it is asking about a man who lived long ago, some don't believe He lived at all, for some it is a question of searching for a deeper relationship with a Savior and Lord, a Redeemer, the Messiah.

We can not exhaust the answers or opinions to the question, for Jesus is not just a man, not just a John the Baptizer whose only message is repentance, not just an Elijah or Jeremiah, who only speaks as a prophet making known the will and presence of God. He is all these things and more.

Who would feel threatened by a wise, caring, holy man? There were claims by Jesus, that caused some to hate Him and see Him as a serious threat to their personal beliefs. Peter professed something beyond natural understanding. It took the Spirit of Holiness enlightening the imperfect Peter to declare Jesus as the Messiah. It was action of the Holy Spirit to confess Christ as the Messiah.

Jesus chose to use this confession of Peter, through the working of the Holy Spirit, to build the church, the assembly of believers. The key, the binding confession of faith is bound and protected by the Holy Spirit sharing its truth with Peter.

Jesus wanted others to know He was the Messiah, but He knew for people to believe accurately that He was the Messiah, it must be built on a firm foundation of faith, faithfilled experiences, and accurate understanding of the miracles and teaching that He brought into the world. He needed time to

teach the Apostles more about Himself, and what to preach to the four corners of the world. For He is God who emptied Himself of His glory to be like us in all things but sin, to free us. **Aboona**
