Matthew 28:16-20 The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Here is another reference to the "Apostles doubting", men who were sent out into the world by Jesus to preach all He taught them. I find it amazing that they would still have doubts after the miracles, bringing the dead back to life, multiplication of bread, walking on the water. What else is there left to prove?

Actually, I am glad they struggled with doubt at times, and that we know about it. There are different levels of doubt. There is the doubt that is totally controlling when a person becomes a cynic and has no expectations regarding anyone or anything. Trust is only an abstract concept for them because they are suspicious of the intentions of everyone they meet, even those they love.

Then there are those who believe almost anything. In fact, we can't believe how ridiculous some of their beliefs are. These are the ones that keep buying the Brooklyn Bridge simply because they changed the name.

They have a distorted or immature inner concept of self, but are always trying to find themselves through the lives, deeds, and words of others.

The wise man or woman is a listener, and tests prudently all they hear. It is wise to weigh the merits of what you hear. There is a tendency for us to hear what we want to hear, and come up with our own meaning to what was said even though that might not be the intention of the speaker. By the time we hear from the third source, it might now be so distorted it would be regarded as slander.

We need to know what our doubts and weaknesses are to make sure we don't draw wrong conclusions that keep us imprisoned by doubts and judgments. One should listen and not be threatened by their doubts. Be willing to seek more information! It is surprising how our lives change when we allow Christ to continue to be in our lives, working through our self-doubts.

Truth does set us free, even when it hurts. When in doubt, keep worshiping. All the commandments of God have love as the foundation for its purpose. When a person is not sure about what to do, do what is a loving thing to do. This is not referring to emotions and feelings but basic decisions of the will. St. Paul says these acts of being a loving person is to show patience, to express a kindness, to not puff up with pride or take delight in hurting the other. Don't use falsehood to get what you want even if you think what you want is something that you love.

The Commandments in which Jesus asks His Apostles to teach throughout the world are immersed in genuine love, which is intrinsically truthful and kind in their expression. This is the basis for freedom. Our world makes this difficult.

What is possible through the power of God is not always believed to be possible. We are often more capable of doing more than we believe we can do. The Holy Spirit is the power that gives us the faith and courage to go beyond what we would ever do left to our own expectations of our self. Once the Apostles received the Holy Spirit thousands came to believe in Jesus and were baptized. Large numbers were healed. **Aboona**
