John 21:15-19

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep."

He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."

Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, "Follow me."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The relationship between Peter and Jesus is one of Love. Even though Peter speaks and acts before thinking. He sincerely believed things about himself that were proven to temporarily not be true about him. He acted tough, and yet behaved out of fear. We all have some of Peter's traits. If we thought Christianity is these traits, many would reject or become indifferent toward being a Christian. Actually many have quit practicing as a Christian because they are continuously bombarded by what is wrong with "us" rather than what is right about Jesus.

Jesus asked Peter if he loved Him, Peter needed to get in touch with his beliefs rather than his fears. Our sinfulness does not make what is true about Jesus false. The Holy Spirit is involved in the sinners' life to transform the sinner. Peter made mistakes regarding his personal decisions, but when proclaiming the truth about Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, he did proclaim Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God. He proclaimed Jesus the Holy Word made flesh, who spoke truth, taught truth, and lived it.

When others were rejecting that Jesus was the Bread that came down from heaven, and that His followers must feed on this Bread. Peter proclaimed he believed Jesus. When others turned away on hearing Jesus say, "unless you eat my flesh, and drink my Blood you will not have eternal life." It was Peter who said, "you have the words of eternal life, you are the Son of God."

Jesus asks Peter, "Feed my sheep." Out of love for Jesus, he promises to feed the sheep. At this time, some followers were only interested in food multiplied by Jesus, or Miracles. Jesus wasn't crucified for this, it was for being the Bread that came down from heaven, the sacrificial Lamb. He was Food. He is the Food of angels.

We are bombarded constantly with an endless supply of information regarding Jesus, regarding those who teach the message and receive the message. In many ways there are thousands of menus of selected food for the sheep. There is such a variety of "foods" out there that society is starving while picking out just the parts they are willing to believe and follow.

When the only news we continuously focus on is the flaws of "Peter" the built and building church that Jesus called to exist, and ignores and distorts the full and complete teachings as lived through the centuries, we create a distorted society obsessed with out healing and hope. There is always a spiritual hunger within us, and that hunger wrongly responded to leads to destructive distortions within religions and cultures.

Follow the healing, compassion, transforming love that Jesus asks of us. Jesus spoke of what is ahead for Peter, the manner of his death. This did not cause him to shrink from following the One he once denied; instead Peter lived the rest of his life focused on the victory of life over death, forgiveness over hatred, and healing over illness. **Aboona**
