**Luke 1:39-45** During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior. For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness; behold, from now on all ages will call me blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. His mercy is from age to age to those who fear him. He has shown might with his arm, dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart. He has thrown down the rulers from their thrones but lifted up the lowly. The hungry he has filled with good things; the rich he has sent away empty. He has helped Israel his servant,

remembering his mercy, according to his promise to our fathers, to Abraham and to his descendants forever." Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

#### Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Holy Spirit brings joy into the hearts of those who believe. The Holy Spirit is a comforter in time of trouble and confusion, not through magic, but by removing fear and giving hope; just those two things can change a life forever.

The six weeks of Announcement are happy announcements because the word "yes" is there. There were dramatic changes in the people involved, and they were able to do extraordinary works because of it. The Holy Spirit is a living power that keeps announcing coming joy and strength. When we allow our spirit and heart to keep being transformed by the message God reveals to us, our life is transformed and lifted up with lasting joy.

Just feeling hope can turn a depressed person completely around. Sometimes we do not always notice when the Holy Spirit is at work. Most of the time it is through subtle steps of faith and trust.

Some are uncomfortable with the attention we show Mary. Sometimes it is because of a particular persons misinformation or excessive devotions to

her. From the moment Jesus was conceived in the womb of Mary; Mary has a son, and Jesus has a mother. This is the choice of the Trinity. The miraculous child of Elizabeth leaped for joy because the Holy Spirit let them see Jesus by looking through the eyes of Mary. How blessed are all generations that we can do the same.

The Holy Spirit proclaims the greatness of the Lord with the voice of Mary who rejoices in her Savior. The Holy Spirit uses a humble virgin and lifts her. So why should there be a problem of venerating the works of the Holy Spirit? Why should anyone be surprised that a lot of blessings and joy are found in those who have a spiritual balanced love for Mary? The more we give our lives to the working of the Holy Spirit, the more we are lifted up and resemble what we love most about God.

Veneration of Mary and the saints is to recognize the Holy Spirit's power in their lives and wanting it in our lives. This helps us focus on magnifying and proclaiming the glory of God. All can see the wondrous works of God, and with different degrees of understanding and belief see God in what He has created.

God calls us to serve Him. Some do this is in extraordinary ways. Mary is one of those people. We in like manner use that same bridge of communication back to God, not as a replacement but as a part of how God acts in our life. It works both ways. In a concrete way, God uses special people to reach us, and we use these special people to reach Him.

During this Season of Announcement we are called to deepen our understanding and belief through what Heaven reveals to us: to raise us above the natural to receive the supernatural. **Aboona**
