Luke 1:5-25 ".... the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, because your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall name him John. And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of [the] Lord. He will drink neither wine nor strong drink. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb, and he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God. He will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah to turn the hearts of fathers toward children and the disobedient to the understanding of the righteous, to prepare a people fit for the Lord." Then Zechariah said to the angel, "How shall I know this? For I am an old man, and my wife is advanced in years." And the angel said to him in reply, "I am Gabriel, who stand before God. I was sent to speak to you and to announce to you this good news. But now you will be speechless and unable to talk until the day these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled at their proper time." Meanwhile the people were waiting for Zechariah and were amazed that he stayed so long in the sanctuary. But when he came out, he was unable to speak to them, and they realized that he

had seen a vision in the sanctuary. He was gesturing to them but remained mute. Then, when his days of ministry were completed, he went home. After this time his wife Elizabeth conceived, and she went into seclusion for five months, saying, "So has the Lord done for me at a time when he has seen fit to take away my disgrace before others."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

If you felt shame and disgrace because you were childless, and now there was a promise that you would be a father or mother even though you believed you were too old; what kind of fame would you want for your child? Would it be for yourself or pride because you are focused on your shame? Would it be all for the glory of God and the salvation of humanity?

God uses the long enduring faithfulness of Zechariah in this Gospel story. His trust is not perfect, but his faith and commitment to his calling in life put him in the place of blessings for the angel's announcement to come true. For Jesus says, "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and all else will follow." Through God's promise and the perfecting and transforming love and

grace of God; the fertile ground was prepared for the seeds of preparation of salvation has begun.

Joy and happiness is not a temporary feeling of elation, but a stable balanced conviction of self-worth and awareness of being right with God, themselves and with their neighbor. The right circumstances must be there for the conception and development to become a fully mature being physically, mentally, and spiritually.

Sin is an obstacle to this happening. We are tempted to act on what seems exciting and fulfilling and the answer to whatever we are struggling with. Only afterwards and sometimes a long time afterwards do we realize how much it may have messed up our life and the lives of others. Sin is all that robs us of the perfection we are meant to have physically, mentally, and spiritually. This season of Announcement is the season of the remedy coming to us.

There are times we are wrong about what will make us happy. Sometimes it remains unclear, but if we keep seeking Him within our heart with trust and honesty, we will be delivered through knowing how much He loves us, and this keeps us coming to His temple to worship Him.
