Matthew 24:1-14

As Jesus came out of the temple and was going away, his disciples came to point out to him the buildings of the temple. Then he asked them, "You see all these, do you not? Truly I tell you, not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?"

Jesus answered them, "Beware that no one leads you astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Messiah!' and they will lead many astray. And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you are not alarmed; for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places: all this is but the beginning of the birth pangs. Then they will hand you over to be tortured and will put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of my name."

"Then many will fall away, and they will betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because of the increase of lawlessness, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this good news of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the world, as a testimony to all the nations; and then the end will come."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

The Temple was destroyed as a place of worship for the Jews to make the yearly sacrifice. There is still a wall where prayers are offered. This area is a source of smoldering tension for Jews, Christians, and Muslims over who has ownership of these sites.

All through Christian history, there is the question of when will the world as we know it come to an end. There are always rumors of wars, kingdoms fighting, a religious sect claiming the signs are now, and be prepared for the end. Up until this very day, what is consistent is that all religious sects, or groups within the general larger body of Christians were wrong.

Trying to interpret Scripture independent of history and Tradition has fragmented Christianity into thousands of conflicting organizations. The Catholic and Orthodox Faith are the only Christian Communities that have an unbroken historical

tradition. This doesn't mean identical rituals and traditions, but the same faith within these rituals.

Unfortunately, as in any book of directions; the directions might be correct in how to live, build together a church, it doesn't mean everyone follows them.

As Catholics we believe we have 100% of the teachings of Christ necessary to safely arrive in the Kingdom of God. An individual within the Catholic Church might only believe and live a small portion of these beliefs, but the teaching is there. It is easily observable that Christians of other gatherings, even without accepting all that the Catholic Faith teaches, can still believe more of what the Catholic Churches teach than what an individual member of the Catholic Church might believe.

This is why it is impossible and also wrong to try to figure out or declare who is saved and not saved. What is possible and right is to seek all that is available to know about Jesus Christ, and to live fully all that he calls us to live.

Jesus certainly is concerned about false teachings regarding Him. Our fears, our greed, our anger, our confusion and jealousies breed the spirit of blindness unable to see the deception and lies. As soon as we began to teach false things about one another, we began to head toward war, persecution, and fear. The words written and spoken become loveless and become a loathing self-righteousness.

Jesus struggled with His own Apostles over this, needing to correct them, for instance when they wanted the buildings to fall on their enemies. To choose evil or mislead through false claims to fight evil makes the world only more evil. **Aboona**
