Luke 10:38-42

As they went on their way, Jesus entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

We have to be careful to not think that by Jesus saying "Mary chose the better part" that what Martha was doing was not also good and important. It's just that there is a time and a place for these tasks to be done. Sometimes work becomes an addiction and an escape from coping and accepting significant other responsibilities and dimensions of living a satisfying life.

It is a distorted spirituality when our activities are used to justify not taking the time to listen to the Lord as He reveals Himself to us. How often we hear the

phrase I do these good things, so that should cover and exempt me from worship activities.

In a sense, Martha represents those who have unresolved issues. Her worries and distractions prevent her from finding peace and harmony in her life. Worry is not what solves problems and can be used for solutions.

Culturally we are "freeing ourselves" from the demands of God and His Sabbath, and exchanging them for chronic consumption of distractions of addiction. Never have we needed more medication – legal and illegal, endless wants to alter our mood, reshape our bodies, and the list goes on. Our hungers put billions in the hands of drug criminals, and trillions belong to the greed of a few.

Life is filled with distractions. There was a recent article on how our need for distractions and worries is increasing especially among young men. The high tech era has made it possible to be immersed in distractions at all times. We all know someone who can stay up all night on the computer playing some sort of a game, while at the same time neglecting their relationship with their spouse, children, friends and even jeopardizing their job.

We may have visited someone, and rather than spend time conversing with you, they remained absorbed with something on their smart phone.

Even with text messaging, one can become so absorbed in their own thoughts and emotions rather than creating a genuine connection with the other, that on physically meeting they find it difficult to relate to each other's actual personality. It is so much easier to have a make believe world, where we control all the information and block out the rest.

Not that these characteristics and habits have not always existed in some manner. It is just made so much easier now. Face to face conversations are simply different from a text message, or email, and for that matter, even the telephone.

For the person who is naturally shy and feels socially clumsy, it becomes easier to retreat into cyberspace. To remain distracted we can lose out on the "better part of life" with real people and fail to learn the skills to socialize with a wide spectrum of ideas and people.

Society is so immersed in the latest distractions and worries; we can become obsessed with our interests and ignore others. Fewer and fewer people are even willing to put themselves in a situation where they can "hear" Jesus say to them stop what you are doing, and come in to listen to the Gospel proclaimed. Stop what you are doing and keep the Sabbath with those gathered around to worship and give praise to the heavenly Father. Fewer and fewer believe what Mary is doing is the better part of life, to overcome anxiety.

When we can filter out anything that challenges our way of thinking and behavior, we run the risk of creating our own concept of God that can be quite different from what God actually reveals to us. This has always been a part of human history, and the resistance to letting God speak to us is obviously influencing our lives. **Aboona**
