Luke 1:26-38 In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be

done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

With Mary saying yes to what the angel announced; the most radical and profound event took place since God chose to create the universe. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, the Divine chose to unite with the Human. The mind cannot completely fathom God bringing into existence everything out of nothing, and now we are being asked to believe the Divine exists so intimately as a part of His creation. That in the womb of Mary the spoken word of God becomes flesh.

Even with the Incarnation being profound beyond human reasoning, there are hints of this mystery in the natural world. Conception of life depends on the previous existence of life. From the moment of conception of human life, that new life is fed nourishment to form and grow as a new being.

The conversation Mary has with the angel reveals the profound event; it lets us know it is understandable to have questions regarding the way God is working in our life. In this case, these are not questions of doubt, but questions showing a spiritual woman seeking deeper understanding. Being a holy, spiritual, faithful follower means you keep seeking understanding and guidance. In order to grow in wisdom, we have to continually be available to God to speak to us; we have to be willing to ponder like Mary.

Fear often is a part of the unknown, and we find in the New Covenant that people who encounter the Divine are told to not be afraid. Even when there is an explanation from the wisdom of God for something that is happening, we often close our ears, and stick to our own way of looking at things. Mary did not close her ears, she tested the vision to make sure it was a true Spirit, and followed the Divine Directions to become all that God chose for her to become.

It is amazing how stubbornly we stick with ideas and explanations that make us miserable and fearful instead of responding to God's ways of miracles, forgiveness and freedom. A sure sign of a person experiencing the presence of the Lord is that their fears in life are on the decrease, and their life continues to become more and more filled with actions of faith, one yes after another to the will of God. **Aboona**
