### John 10:22-42

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense?

If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly." Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me.

I give them eternal life, and they will never perish.

No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand.

The Father and I are one." The Jews took up stones again to stone him. Jesus replied, "I have shown you many good works from the Father. For which of these are you going to stone me?"

The Jews answered, "It is not for a good work that we are going to stone you, but for blasphemy, because you, though only a human being, are making yourself God." Jesus answered, "Is it not written in your law, 'I said, you are gods'? If those to whom the word of God came were called 'gods' — and the scripture cannot be annulled can you say that the one whom the Father has sanctified and sent into the world is blaspheming because I said, 'I am God's Son'? If I am not doing the works of my Father, then do not believe me. But if I do them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, so that you may know and understand that the Father is in me and I am in the Father."

Then they tried to arrest him again, but he escaped from their hands. He went away again across the Jordan to the place where John had been baptizing earlier, and he remained there.

Many came to him, and they were saying, "John performed no sign, but everything that John said about this man was true." And many believed in him there.

### Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus by saying that He is the good Shepherd and His sheep hear His voice and follow Him is also saying that there are those who hear His voice and are not going to follow Him. In this story it is some of His own people who are against Him. They want Him arrested. In this situation it is some of the Jews living at that time. It should be made perfectly clear, that at any time in history there are people who claim to belong to the right religion but their actions betray it. Just like Adam, the word for man, and Eve for woman; we have to choose between what we think will make us like a god but doesn't, or to live a life that images God and does.

Every person on earth worships something. It could be their distorted beliefs in God. It could be their animosities and hatreds or their pleasures, vices and addictions they worship. Some worship their nostalgia of the past, frozen in time rather than living in time with a Living God.

The Mystical Body of Christ, the Church, the Assembly of believers, is always in need of Renewal. This isn't a change of beliefs, but to stay focused on the substance rather than the packaging. To keep from straining out gnats while swallowing the camel. Jesus is the true vine, and sometimes we need pruning. Jesus knew there would be scandals. He knew Judas was a thief. The papers remind us every chance they can in how right Jesus was in what He had to say. There are Shepherds and there are hirelings. There are saints and there are sinners.

There are always stone throwers ready to kill. In the hand of Jesus is healing and forgiveness. This should never be confused with permission to do evil, but the right treatment at hand; grace and mercy, forgiveness and healing, but let us not ignore with deaf ears Him also saying, "sin no more".

In the Gospel Jesus is confronted with concrete obvious hostility. Christianity is being persecuted in more places now than the age of martyrs of the first centuries. Evil fundamentalism is within eyesite of a predominantly Christian town in Syria that still uses the Aramaic that Jesus spoke. This belief that Jesus is the Son of God, where the Divinity of God is united with the humanity of man and woman, still incites the desire to stone, arrest, and kill.

Our culture is not innocent either, it is wiping out the voice of the Shepherd who gathered people close to Him to listen to His Word. Almost any form of worship is acceptable but the Shepherd who calls us to His temple today, worshiping what He gave us, they way He wanted to be remembered by His Apostles and disciples. **Aboona**
