Matthew 24:23-31

"If anyone says to you, 'Look! Here is the Messiah!' or 'There he is!' — do not believe it. For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and produce great signs and omens, to lead astray, if possible, even the elect. Take note, I have told you beforehand. So, if they say to you, 'Look! He is in the wilderness,' do not go out. If they say, 'Look! He is in the inner rooms,' do not believe it. For as the lightning comes from the east and flashes as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Wherever the corpse is, there the vultures will gather. "Immediately after the suffering of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven will be shaken. Then the sign of the Son of Man will appear in heaven, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see 'the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven' with power and great glory. And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from

the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Jesus was talking to His people and when He used this word "Messiah" they understood Him according to how they understood what they were taught. Some of them were taught that the Messiah would be a warrior that would free them from the rule of the Romans. Even within Christianity you can find some over emphasizing a political and prosperity message rather than the healing of the sick and the lifting of the poor, and the clothing of the naked.

The most spiritually humble of most religions seek the restoration of the human being to one of peace and healing. There is the symbolic desire to restore humanity to the status of Adam and Eve before the fall from friendship with God. The Messiah would be a person anointed with a message that if it is followed, all the world would certainly be a more peaceful and healthy.

Jesus believed that He was the Messiah, that if we follow Him we will regain friendship with God, be freed one day from the scourge of death and illness, and no more rulers who enslave others physically or mentally. The list can go on and on, as we experience what hurts us. We can continuously discover what makes the world we live in a better place to live.

The false messiahs are those who are able to convince others they speak for God but do not. They can become so delusional they even began to think they are divine. An observation of the world religions shows how prevalent this is and how hard it is to discern what is true and what is false. Sometimes its followers are able to self-correct the reality of what actually took place by its founders and re-present the religion in a more modest and pleasing way. This often means they have to repress and keep secrete some aspects of the life of their founder.

There are caring and thoughtful people found in all religions. There can be powerful and uplifting natural and wise truths that can appeal to the soul and spirit. It is also true within all religions you can find disturbed people who grossly express the worse in the fallen nature of humanity and magnify select teachings to until they are so distorted they deceive leading to destructive and evil consequences.

A Christian can still be just as much in need of repenting of sin and the perfecting power of God's grace as the one who does not recognize Jesus by name. There are those who do not know Jesus by His name, but live internally the message that leads to eternal life. This can be understood in the story Jesus tells us He is the least of brethren.

The trumpets will be the sound of a joyous return. I am fascinated by the translation, "and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other." There are many places besides our earth that have wind, and the heavens are unmeasurable.
