Luke 7:36-50

One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and took his place at the table. And a woman in the city, who was a sinner, having learned that he was eating in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster jar of ointment. She stood behind him at his feet, weeping, and began to bathe his feet with her tears and to dry them with her hair.

Then she continued kissing his feet and anointing them with the ointment. Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw it, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what kind of woman this is who is touching him — that she is a sinner."

Jesus spoke up and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." "Teacher," he replied, "Speak." "A certain creditor had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. When they could not pay, he canceled the debts for both of them. Now which of them will love him more?"

Simon answered, "I suppose the one for whom he

canceled the greater debt." And Jesus said to him, "You have judged rightly." Then turning toward the woman, he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has bathed my feet with her tears and dried them with her hair. You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not stopped kissing my feet. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment.

Therefore, I tell you, her sins, which were many, have been forgiven; hence she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." Then he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." But those who were at the table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" And he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

We are all affected by sin. Sin should not be only understood as things that we did wrong, or failed to do. If there was no sin in the world there would be no death, illness, anger, pain, hurt, confusion, jealousy;

in other words, all those things that bring sadness hurt, pain, and misery into our life,

Our actions and thoughts can separate us from God and others, even ourselves. Jesus, by His very nature and purpose proves that it is not God that pushes away, but we push God away. In the story of creation in Genesis, creation is declared good, If the world in life was going to be anything less than good, it would take a decision other than God's. These Pharisees did not understand God's desire to reconcile us to Him through mercy and compassion.

This woman knows she has sinned and has sorrow and tears of grief. In humility she bows down in worship. The sorrow and repentance cleanses her, and in a ritual way, washes the feet of Jesus. Jesus does not have to be cleansed but in a mysterious way our cleansing of Him cleans us; for Jesus is the naked, the hungry, the imprisoned, the thirsty, the ones who need forgiveness and mercy for that very same virtue to grow in us.

The woman's humility and sorrow allowed her to be completely open, not looking for permission to continue in sin without a need to feel sorrow, but to gain inner healing and dignity to be truly free to experience genuine life changing compassion.

This woman was willing to go into the home of a person she knew judged her without love, to be healed and transformed by a person, who loved her and would forgive her. She found grace and mercy to overcome her sins. Sometimes this may happen immediately; but more often, over a period of time through patient prayer.
