Matthew 10:1-7

Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew: Thomas and Matthew the collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him. These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

It is not common to "cast out unclean spirits" and we don't depend on using authority to cure every disease or sickness to bring people to believe in Jesus as the Messiah, but He still wants us to do this. We do this in subtle ways when we are doing His will. The problem is, we find doing His will difficult, or we rationalize excuses for not living out all He teaches us.

A rigid frightened and judgmental mind is not open to the message that is necessary for the challenges of today. It might have worked decades or centuries ago, but maybe not tomorrow. We should always be making progress in understanding evil and illness. This is only possible if we have an open mind. I am a firm believer, for instance if the scientific and medical mind was open to all the medical knowledge of all cultures, whether they are in the jungles of the Amazon or the mountains of Tibet; there are solutions to all our illnesses. Sometimes it is our refusal to simply stop a habit.

I think the same applies to our spiritual life. In the Gospels it says that if everything was written down in what Jesus did and said, all the books in the world could not contain them. This might not be a literal fact, but certainly is a spiritual fact. Every person everywhere is searching for something to satisfy their spiritual needs. We may not be conscious of this, but we are. For a secular society to reject a spiritual life that unites us together, that society cannot survive for long.

I remember in the seminary the Novice Master mentioning that being "spirituality independent" of the wisdom of religious leaders is nothing more than

naval gazing; only thinking of oneself. Patting oneself on the back, or convincing others to pat themselves on the back has no power to stop evil from taking over, or address how we will overcome illness. The love that Jesus taught is unifying command.

When Jesus says "the kingdom of God has come near", We will still be in the process of accomplishing His plan. Realistically, as long as we have freewill, there will be those who reject Him and be stumbling blocks to accomplish all that Jesus wills for us.

Jesus asks His Apostles to first start with "their own" When we truly believe and know that His message transforms, we do everything we can to make the soil of our brain be receptive to His message and fertile for the seed of faith to grow. With no spiritual food, or very little, or misinformed knowledge of the faith, there is little chance for the genuine seed of faith to take root and grow in courage and bear the fruit of compassion and mercy. This is why it is crucial for parents to give and live by example of the Christian faith for their children to observe and to absorb it into their very being.

I believe Pope Francis is doing all he can to address the spiritual needs of this generation. The same truth needs to be preached to an ear that is different than it was in the past. Not by rejecting what is true, but removing the barriers that get in the way of hearing the truth.
