Luke 10:21-24

At that same hour Jesus rejoiced in the Holy Spirit and said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows who the Son is except the Father, or who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him." Then turning to the disciples, Jesus said to them privately, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see! For I tell you that many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it."

Dear Parishioners and Friends.

What is it that some can see and others cannot? What did these prophets and kings wish to see? What would you like to see?

We are all aware that not everyone sees the world around us in the same way. There are countless reasons for this. Since God began to reveal Himself to us, we are made aware of the promise of a coming Messiah who would restore all of creation to its original beauty innocence. The Chosen People focused on this as central to their hope. The kings of the tribes of Israel and their prophets longed for this day. Jesus found it difficult to convince them that He was the promised one. He tells His Apostles that it is a gift to believe in God, and a gift to see Him as the awaited Messiah. We as Christians do believe that He is the Messiah, the promised

There is no way for anyone to judge any individual in whether or not they would accept the Christian message under all situations in which the worlds humanity finds themselves. There at different places and times where the only example given for Christianity are people who are not living it. This is reminder of important it is for us to truly live the faith, not just know about it.

We are aware that there are those who belong to a Christian Church but do not reflect the core beliefs of the faith in their lives. We also know that there are those who do not profess Christianity but in their behavior, the reverence

for the Divine, and how they treat others can be very admirable and referred to has Christ like.

It is so important to see accurately. When we can see the real issue and not just our own agenda or wish for position and power, we are reflecting the Spirit of truth. When we want to hear the truth and presented the truth objectively, it is of the Spirit.

The bottom question is, can and does God want to reveal Himself accurately? As Catholics we believe He does. If we say yes, God does reveal Himself through Divine Inspiration, how do we know which of the claimed writings are truly representing God fully? For we need to know how important it is to not become over consumed and obsessed with the incidentals and ignore what is actually of great significance in being spiritually healthy and a light of hope and love.

In some manner, every day we are challenged to follow His teachings, to reject a teaching of His, or return to His teaching. Jesus is the Son of God who remained faithful to the end, and in that faithfulness is able to share with us the completed message of eternal life.
