John 14:21-27

"They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them."

Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?"

Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

"I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus is making it clear that love is not empty words, but following His commandments and learning His teachings. When our actions match our words then we desire to give Him worship and praise according to His plan.

This is an important understanding. The person who wants something for His own personal satisfaction can learn how to say the right words, but does not offer a lasting trustworthy love. The abuser knows the right words to sweep their love interest off their feet. The all-consuming love at first is flattering, but one step out side of the self centered obsession and "love" vanishes. Flattery does not impress God; genuine trust in His Word and self-giving is what He looks for in us and we look for in each other.

The dynamics of the "first sin" is the lack of trust in the believabilty in what God has to say. They became distracted from reason God's forbid them to eat from a certain tree. On the natural level of reasoning, we can say, "What can be so wrong about eating a piece of fruit?" Adam and Eve knew nothing about evil pain, whether physical, spiritual, or emotional. Often the temptation that begins to destroy our relationship with God is the one we are convinced is too insignificant to matter.

Even though Adam and Eve walked daily in the garden with God, they sinned by not waiting to talk to Him about the offer of the forbidden fruit, but talked to the serpent instead to make their decision. We can be easily deceived, when we only talk at God but listen to the "serpent".

Love and trust of God is to talk to Him and believe that He has our best interest at heart. To make His teachings insignificant is to make Jesus nothing more than a few powerless platitudes on a plaque, rather than the Living God of Salvation.

Jesus says to not let our hearts be troubled, even though it is all around us. I like to think of it as the "look both ways" situation. No matter how good we are, we still have to look both ways when we cross the street. Traffic can be annoying and it can also be deadly. When we know all the variables of the traffic, we can cross even a busy street safely. But we need to know these variables.

The same is true in our understanding of God's commandments. They are motivated by God's love for us, and they can protect us and guide us safely through the troubles of the world.

Our news tells us over and over and over, that even sincere intentions if made in ignorance, mixed with the deception and greed can be devastating for others. Our failure in spreading the gospel is a guarantee that we will be confronted with radically different beliefs.

Did you notice how often it is a vehicle of transportation that is used to spread terror? Are we committed to transporting the Gospel of peace into our heart and into the hearts of others hungry for genuine peace? A sincere faith guiding the actions of believers does transform the world. **Aboona**
