

Matthew 25:31-46

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me,

I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no

food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The gospel is not about giving out a list to follow, and if you follow it you will be saved and if we don't we will not be saved. Ultimately we are saved by God's loving grace and mercy. Salvation is a relationship with God, our self and our neighbor.

Jesus presents Himself in a manner that makes Him very vulnerable and in some ways unappealing. We can't fake empathy, the ability to feel with the other person. It is a tempting to observe a characteristic or action, and due to our perception and attitude write them off, and declare them unworthy of mercy and understanding.

Every day we make decisions. Some are small,

some are big, but they all add up to something that can become very significant in who we become by the time we stand before the Lord.

Even if a person did not believe in God or Satan, he cannot escape from the difference between truth and lies. When Jesus sits on His throne, He does not turn us into a goat. He simply identifies our chosen characteristics. Until our physical death, we can choose how we will exist for eternity. Jesus has to be presented as the one who identifies and separates; this is because the liar to others is a liar to one's self. By Jesus telling a story of those doing good without knowing they were doing it for Him; He is able to say their goodness came truly from their love for others and not simply motivated to do good as a "form of bribery" to have Jesus ignore the evil they do.

The deceitful know exactly how to charm, who to charm, who to look good in front of, how to make it sound true, how to play on fears, to be convincing ... to get what they want. History is filled with tragedies of leaders who misled with convincing deception. Rich, poor, weak, powerful; no group is immune to having a hardened heart.

It would be great if it were easy to distinguish between those truly in need and those who are manipulating the system. It is better to err on the side of compassion.

Jesus offers a leadership that is motivated by compassion and mercy. The best hand out is the one that is combined with giving the inner moral character Jesus gives to those who believe in Him, that provides dignity, confidence and hope. There are ways of giving that enslaves others, and ways that provide dignity and a means of providing hope and the inner qualities to become free of what it is that enslaves them. **Aboona**
