This Day's Gospel Saint John 13:31-35

When out, he had gone **Jesus** said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Aboona's Weekly Reflection

The last couple weeks I have been impressed by the generous work and devotion of many of you to the parish. These have been hard times. It is a tribute to your faith and charity to see you step forward in these difficult days. It is edifying to witness, and gratifying to share in this apostolate. May the Compassionate One shed His light, grace and blessings on you and your families for such generosity.

We the baptized are all members of the one Church that is an extension through time and space of the divine Mystery of the Messiah – the Word-madeflesh. Once glorified at the Right Hand of the Father in His Ascension, Our Lord remains present to mankind, continuing His presence and work of salvation through His Church. The Church is an extension of the Incarnation. In various manners and in a multitude of ways is this accomplished, but especially through the divine Mysteries -- the Sacraments.

In the Mystical Body of Christ, our tradition from the beginning has been to call those men "shepherds" who have been consecrated to the holy priesthood in the Sacred Mystery of Holy Orders. In each generation their vocation is to work with the flock of Christ in all His members as they together move toward the Great Day of the Lord. In the West, we call these men by the Latin term, "pastor." Regionally, the work is accomplished by the bishop, and locally by the parish priest.

As stated in the rites of ordination, and in the sacred canons, the primary and fundamental responsibility of these shepherds is to guide, to teach and to sanctify. They do this through leadership, direction, catechesis, sermons, counsel, and especially as stewards of the Mysteries of God in the sacramental rites, primarily in the Holy Eucharist. For these men, these offices are both privileges and serious obligations.

One of the primary responsibilities of the pastor as laid out by the sacred canons is that of offering each week, on the Lord's Day, the Sacrifice of the Mass for the intentions of the parishioners. As a result, the private intentions for which the Mass may be offered might be limited and subordinated to this scheduled obligation. In the future - perhaps sometime in September - we will begin to schedule the Mass Intention for the Faithful of the Parish as the regular Sunday Mass at 10:00 a.m. Obviously, there may be exceptions to this, namely when there is an Anniversary of death on the actual date of a Forty Day Mass that will need to be offered on the Sunday itself. We will work to make this happen. On the weekends when this does occur the Mass at 4:00 p.m. will then be offered for the Faithful of the Parish.

May the Holy *Qoorbono*, the Divine Eucharistic Sacrifice, ever remain the center and source of our lives as Maronite Catholics.
