"Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

John 20:24-31

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in His hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." week later His disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then He said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Conclusion: Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of [His] disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may [come to] believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God,

and that through this belief you may have life in His name.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

It has always fascinated me that Jesus did so "many other signs" in the presence of His disciples that it was impossible to write everything down. The Scriptures do have enough necessary information for us to believe that Jesus is the Messiah. There comes a time when nothing more can be said to change a person's mind about what they believe. Sometimes the only way a person can grow spiritually is when they are willing to be changed by the reality of the Life of Jesus.

If the Bible tried to give a detailed explanation for every question throughout history a person might think about, the Bible could never be finished. Each one of us, without even knowing it, has criteria for what is necessary for us to believe. Blessed are those who can believe without seeing His wounds. Jesus is not saying

Thomas was not blessed for seeing His wounds, but that there are a variety of ways we come to belief without actually touching His wounds.

Sometimes we become "unblessed" because in our pride we come with demands or expectations of what a god needs to be like in order for us to believe. Blessed is the one who does not get to see their definitions of a god, but believes what has been revealed to us through the preaching of the Apostles and the Bishops that followed concerning the faith reveals the true nature of the One true God.

Truth can be found in Scripture and through Sacred Tradition of the Apostles and the Church. History shows without a balanced belief in Scripture, Tradition, and Apostolic authority serious errors can be made in the understanding and actions of believers.

Jesus is always reaching out to us even in our doubts. He respects our free will, and it is up to us to place our life in His hands. Thomas touched His wounds, and Jesus touches our wounds through our coming to Him and accepting what is true about Him.

Jesus cannot offer us something that is not true. So if we pray for something that is not true, we cannot make it true no matter how sincere or convinced we are.

Truth does set us free; free to head in the right direction. In Thomas wanting to touch the wounds of Jesus it becomes a challenge for all of us. Do we use ours to embrace more deeply the wounded Christ, or become absorbed in our own wounds and desire no message from Him that heals? Thomas believed that eternal life was on the other side of suffering through and with Jesus. **Aboona**
