Christ has Risen! He truly has Risen!

Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; He is not here. Look, there is the place they laid Him.

But go, tell His disciples and Peter that He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see Him, just as He told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Without faith, a few people finding an empty tomb would not convince people to believe that a Jewish man was resurrected from the dead and was the Son of God. Faith is a gift from God, A long history of God revealing Himself prepared us to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the promised One who would bring salvation to our broken humanity.

There are millions still searching and waiting for this gift of faith. They may not even know it. The world continuously is searching for a message of peace that will work, a remedy for their pain, a hope that sustains them. Human philosophy, various spiritualties, and discoveries can bring us close to this, but its perfection and completeness is through Jesus Christ.

Christianity believes that we need a compassionate form of transformation to live eternally with God. We believe we can be restored to exist in peace, and embraced by an all-consuming love.

We don't need proofs that people die, hurt, grieve, and struggle with pain, disappointment, and can be devastated by betrayal. The fact that we can imagine a more perfect world to live in is innate because a perfect world was created for us and our spirit hungers and searches to return to this place.

Jesus entered our world to experience it the way a human experiences life. He can carry our burdens, forgive our sins, and restore our broken lives. The thief on the cross confessed Him and then entered Paradise to be with Jesus. The thief who wanted to judge others and make excuses for his choices wouldn't even look at the path to Paradise. The thief chose to walk the way of redemption with Jesus; he wanted to be remembered by Jesus.

Jesus knows His message changes the way we exist. In the miracles that He worked, He healed the broken bodies and hearts of whomever He touched. Our bodies can do wondrous things in self-healing and with medicines, but ultimately there comes a time and situation where the body and science can do no more, and to live again comes through a Creator that repairs.

The ultimate power is the power that Christ has over death. The Good News is that we don't forever have to suffer the consequences of our actions if we turn away from the wrongs that we do. The power of God's love is that we change our responses to the world that we live in. When the soldiers were arresting Jesus, Peter used his sword to defend Jesus, in doing so; he cut the soldier's ear off. Jesus told Peter, that those who live by the sword die by the sword and Jesus then healed the soldier.

In the dramatic events leading to the crucifixion, and resurrection, choices were made to act in fear or live in faith. Faith keeps us from allowing the sins of others, and our own sins pull us away from the path of truth. Times have not changed. Jesus heals, transforms, forgives, challenges, teaches, rescues, and finally brings us into His safe and protected Kingdom. Our creator still lives! **Aboona**
