John 2:1-11 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him. "They have no wine." [And] Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine. without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so

revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

This Sunday's Gospel is fascinating. You would not expect the first public miracle would be to make sure there was good wine at a wedding; and to make so much of it! There is an abundance of information revealed at this wedding. On the basic human level; a personal relationship with Jesus is not a "kill joy" relationship. All creation is made clean. However, we can abuse God's creation which can be highly destructive and dangerous; even be used for evil.

This story reveals the proper role of Mary. Elsewhere in the Gospels we are taught, where two or more are gathered in His Name, there I am with them. She is with us in her concern and prayer. She does not tell Jesus what to do, but like when we gather together to pray or ask others to pray for us, she can gather too.

as Mary says through the Holy Spirit, "my soul magnifies the Lord". Gathered prayer magnifies for us to see the power and the Glory of God. In everything Jesus did, He tried to bring people together to celebrate. To challenge, heal and transform us in a manner that we will want to gather together. He can gather up all our

We don't gather together to overpower God, but

gather together. He can gather up all our emptiness, (the jars), take what we ordinarily have and use, (water), and make it a delightful gathering, (wine).

In this modern society, we can forget how important and difficult it was to have good safe drinking water. Wine was one of the safest ways to have one's thirst satisfied. This is still true in many places. Contaminated water is still a health hazard for millions, lead numerous other pathogens can be found even in developed countries.

On Cana Sunday, we have the universal symbol of human love, marriage. In this Mystery (Sacrament), Jesus is transforming the gathering, step by step. By concern, caring, obedience, trust, and faith; Jesus' mission to us begins. **Aboona**

LENTEN REGULATIONS

CANA SUNDAY, Feb 26, marks the beginning of Lent, **GREAT FRIDAY**, April 14, marks the end of Lent.

Abstinence from meat is observed on all the Fridays of Lent by all faithful from the ages of 18 to 65.

Fasting from all food and drink (except water and medicine) is to be observed from midnight until noon on Ash Monday and Great Friday of the Crucifixion. Optional would be the traditional abstinence from meat on Wednesdays.

Those who are unable to fast because of health must perform other penances and acts of charity.

Church Etiquette

Refrain from long and loud conversations, **no food or drinks in church**, no leaving of pews during the reading of the Gospel and the Consecration of the Bread and Wine. Check to see if your cell phone is off.
