John 3:1-16

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?"

Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? "Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

God's relationship to the world is one of Love; He does not see what He has created as competition with His love. It is obvious that we are to love and care for all creation; to hold it sacred, and protect it. To exist is a profound gift from God, even when circumstances are not always at their best. In life,

there might be times where almost everything seems to be going wrong. In God's plan, what is wrong will come to an end by us choosing what is right. He offers us help, He offers us healing; He offers us grace and mercy.

Love always has boundaries in order to survive and flourish. We can move away from love; sin is the action that moves us away from God. Some are so grave; they are called deadly because there is no spiritual life left.

Baptism is not an optional way to become a child of the Heavenly Father. This is what Jesus told His followers to do when they are seeking Eternal life. It is true that we are alive before baptism in the same way that we are alive before we are physically born. To stay alive sooner or later we have to be born. On the Spiritual level, without a spiritual birth, there is not an eternal life filled with peace, joy and light.

Because God so loved the world, all creation is sacred, especially human life, because it is created in the image of God. We are conscious of the promises that God gives human life to be totally restored. All human life is worthy of redemption, and perfect eternal existence with Him. Aboona Larry

Standing

Sometimes I can hear people give out a sigh of relief when they are finally able to sit down during the Liturgy. You stand from the creed all the way to the beginning of the intercessions. I do a slight "Hula", I bend my knees slightly and step to the left slightly at the beginning of a prayer, and at the end of the prayer I do the same only I move to the right. This movement removes the stress on the legs and back.
