John 1:29-34 – Sunday after Epiphany

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

Dear Parishioners and friends,

John, the Baptizer, is a relative of Jesus. Before he was even born he sensed the presence of Jesus, who was also still in the womb of Mary. Elizabeth could feel her son John, moving with joy within her. They were keenly aware of a profound presence of

the Divine, and they were filled with prophetic joy and peace. It is interesting that the Gospel has John saying, "he did not know him" even though actually he knew Jesus even before either of them was born. To express this "not knowing" can be confusing if one does not look for the intended message expressed in this Gospel. Many things come to mind in how this can be understood. Just because we know something does not mean that it has changed our life. We can be indifferent to very profound events. In this expression, it is made clear that John and Jesus didn't work together to create a new religion. They continued to say yes to the plan of They let it unfold and develop ever strengthening their faith expressed by their actions and deeds. Using the revelations of the past joined to the experiences of the present, we now have revealed to us through the Holy Spirit the Teachings of all teachings.

The thunderous voice heard by the witnesses verifies that this was not a private plan between two

relatives, but manifestation of the plan of the Heavenly Father. The accomplishment of the promise made to Adam and Eve is in process. To believe that Jesus is the Son of God is the power of the Holy Spirit, without it, we cannot believe this.

God had called John to baptize and prepare the way for Jesus by calling Israel to repent of their sins. This message that John proclaimed very quickly became a message for all humanity. The baptism that John performed does not literally take away sins, but it brought the hearts and minds of those who accepted his preaching to be open to the One Who will take the sin of the world away.

It we were ever to discover a society that had no system to confront wrong doing in hopes that what is wrong will be stopped, it would have to be a society that is collapsing in complete destruction. To the degree we are able to discern correctly what is wrong and be willing to do what is right dictates how quickly or slowly we move toward decrease or increase our destruction or recover.

John decreases, not in the manner of how valuable his message of repentance is but that this message increases the probability of who will follow the Son of God. No one's relationship with God increases without decreasing in those things that pull us away from Him. The message of John is not in competition with the message of Jesus. From the moment Mary visited Elizabeth, the unknown ways in which they leapt with joy in the presence of the Holy Trinity, Jesus began changing the world with in increase in grace and mercy. **Aboona**
