#### Luke 2:41-52

Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced [in] wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

#### **Dear Parishioners and Friends:**

If you lost your child, how many days would you spend looking for him or her before you visited a church/temple? Who would you find there? Is it among the places a family would consider a safe place to go if they were lost or look for what is missing?

We learn that Jesus, at the age of twelve, knew who His real father was, and already had a talent for sharing and explaining the Scriptures. Just because Jesus was God didn't mean that He couldn't grow in wisdom because He also had to experience what it truly meant to be human, the awe of discovering, the feelings of being hurt, and hurting others, not in a sinful way, but the many unintentional ways we misunderstand others.

There are people who are not even close to being "like God", but think they know everything about God when it pertains to justifying their behavior. That behavior often turns out to be harmful to oneself and to others.

The Scriptures say Jesus was obedient to His parents. I have wondered in what manner a perfect kid behaves as they are growing up. Maybe, in this case Jesus learned that it was wiser to ask His parents if He could stay in Jerusalem rather than leave them distraught with worry. The whole dynamics of growing up, learning how to not offend and hurt others can be complicated even when the child is perfect. When there is no concern or desire to learn, what is offensive and hurtful, we can expect a disintegrating world filled with willful harm. There was a snippet of news where someone at the UN was speaking about the crimes in Syria, "Is there nothing shameful left that you would not do...."

The other day I heard a person expressing their dismay that in a few minutes of watching the news they were bombarded with people dying of drug overdoses, fights, thefts, violence, murder, homelessness, war crimes, and hate crimes. This person wondered what in the world is happening to the morals of our society. I wanted to contact this person and say they have rejected organized organizations, such as the church and have embraced individualistic selections of what would please them and reject what doesn't.

It can be very difficult to discern when we are making truly spiritual and morally good decisions, the moral consequences to our life, others and our society and culture might not show up until the next generation. The freedom to do what is wrong has probably never been more permissible in our history.

Certainly, there is less Temple news coming into our homes. It only stands to reason our world will reflect this. We, as a society, are trying to shape our culture in a fragmented individualistic manner without the hand of God involved. Our words might say love, but when the fruit begins to ripe it tastes like selfish hate and division.

We have our news and God has His News? Where are you going to hear, "The Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ is given to you for the forgiveness of sins and for eternal life." And the person actually gave His life so we all can have life? **Aboona**
