TDIS ÓAY'S EDISTLE Galatians 3: 15-22

My brethren, I speak as among men; a man's covenant which is confirmed, no one setteth aside, or changeth anything in it.

Now to Abraham was the Promise made, and to his seed. And it said to him, not, to thy *seeds*, as being many; but to thy *seed*, as being one, which is the Messiah.

And this I say: that the covenant which was previously confirmed by God in the Messiah, the Law – which was four hundred and thirty years after – cannot set it aside, and nullify the Promise.

And if the inheritance were by the Law, it would not be by promise: but God gave it to Abraham by promise.

What then is the Law? It was added on account of transgression, until that seed should come, to Whom belonged the Promise. And the Law was given by angels through a mediator.

Now a mediator is not of one; but God is one.

Is the Law then opposed to the Promise of God? Far be it!

For if the Law had been given, which could make *alive*, then certainly, righteousness would have been by the Law.

But the Scripture hath enclosed all under sin, that the Promise by faith in Jesus the Messiah might be given to them that believe.



You will progress in understanding the Holy Scriptures only to the degree that you yourself have made progress through contact with them.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

In our Syriac tradition, the Holy Mother of God is portrayed as a richly laden vessel. The poetic imagery is of a ship filled with riches and gifts that traverses the world sharing its treasures. We sang this at the Ginnaz at Monday's funeral:

A new vessel
has been seen laden with a great Reward,
traversing a stormy sea enriched by its Store.
Mary is the vessel's name,
Christ within her the Reward
Who travels throughout the world
to give mortals life.

This beautiful imagery then is grounded in today's celebration of the Announcement to the Ever-Virgin Mary. This is the day that "loads" the "new vessel" with the riches of Heaven through the Incarnation of the Divine Word. The Spirit of Holiness "places" that Richness within the stainless womb of the sinless virgin. The arrival in that sacred place by the New Adam was another moment of grace that elevated the simple virgin of Nazareth to the status of the "New Eve", true Mother of all the living. This also makes her the new "Woman", the beginning of the new creation in her own conception, and she was addressed as such by Our Lord at Cana and on Calvary.

There are a multitude of images that can be drawn from the treasures of Syriac theological poetry, and many of them were named in the Ramsho of this exalted Sunday.

The Mother of God is the vehicle, the "new vessel", that the Hidden God chose to bring the Savior into the fallen world of men, and so it is through her that we return to the Hidden Father. This new Vessel – with the Store she carries – "sails" and communicates ("trades", one might say) between heaven and earth. We receive the Sacred Cargo from the holy Mother of God, and enriched by It, we are borne to the Harbor of Salvation, carried on that richly laden Ship.

Divine riches the Blessed Virgin brings, and we live when we find refuge in this Vessel, traversing over the melancholy and despair that – left on their own – produce the sad waves and storms of this world. Because of the Son she bears, she is the hope of the human race. She is the true Tree of Paradise that bears her Incarnate Son, the true Fruit of Eternal Life.

As the path by which God entered the world, so it is that she is *our* return path to Him. Without Marian devotion, and without recognition of the "New Eve", one cannot be fully Christian. Without her there is no "vessel" of passage, and without her there is no true Mother of the Living, who brings us into the eternal life of God.

The Churches of both East and West teach that Mary is inseparable from Jesus in the salvation of the world. This is expressed in a simple, but fundamental, theological manner by our Syriac

Fathers. In the Roman Church, this doctrine is most profoundly expressed in the writings of Saint Louis de Montfort: *God comes to us through Mary, so it is that we go to Jesus (Incarnate Word, and Face of the Hidden Father) through Mary.*



In the Conception announced today, the Kingdom of God established a beachhead in mankind through the woman who responded freely to the Archangel Gabriel. From that initial "landing" it is through Mary that the Kingdom continues to spread in the conquest of grace. God chose her from all eternity, and He does not repent of His choices; He will not work to spread the Kingdom of salvation other than through her and with her.

The Hidden One, of course, could have acted otherwise, but this is the eternally free choice made by the Holy One. Mary is central to salvation, and the redemption of the human race radiates through her, not because her nature requires it, but because God in this present order of providence deigned it to be so. This truth we contemplate today in the Gospel, and we will continue to meditate upon it throughout this sacred week.

The God of Holiness *enters spiritually within us through her*, and so it is we must respond "in" her so that we can return to Him. Simple logic this is, and a source of great hope when we understand that a mere creature could occupy such a place in the work of redemption. As Saint Thomas Aquinas taught, the Mother of God "touches" the edge of Infinity.

From all eternity, before the foundation of the world, God's choice of His Eternal Son to become incarnate includes the Blessed Virgin Mary in that same eternal view, will, and choice. Therefore, from eternity to eternity, unique among all creatures, Mary is exalted with her divine Son. She is the New Eve partnered to the New Adam, so that their children might live eternally.

All we need do to live is to respond in confidence to this Mother of Fair Love. Grace initiates this confidence, and it is in her gentle hands that our zeal for the Hidden One will be enkindled.

Marian devotion, therefore, is not something added to the practice of the Faith; it is central to it, even as Mary of Nazareth is central to the work of redemption. Mary is, in many ways, the essence of the Christian Faith as collaborator, channel, mediatrix, and exemplar.

Could anything be more beautiful than to know that the Infinitely Luminous One chose to create one of us to collaborate uniquely with Him so as to restore in each of us the marred divine image? She is the perfect exemplar of created humanity, the model of the faithful, and she labors at all times to raise us up with her.

The Immaculate Virgin is the hope of our race, and the most radiant creature ever brought forth from nothingness by the Hand of the Creator. The Self-Existent One did this so that He might manifest His splendid goodness in the face of a created woman, and **through her** to appear among us personally as the God-Man.

The apostolic Faith bequeathed to us is breathtaking in its beauty.

Hail, Full-of-Grace!

Grant them health, and raise them up from their illness, and make them to have perfect health of body and soul and strengthen them in spirit; for Thou art our Savior and Benefactor, the Lord of lords and Weaver of crowns, Thou art Lord and King of all. Amen


