II Corinthians 11: 21-30

I speak as if under contempt: I speak as if we were impotent, through deficiency of understanding; that in whatever thing anyone is daring, I also am bold. If they are Hebrews, so I also: or if they are Israelites, I also. If they are the seed of Abraham, I too. If they are ministers of the Messiah (in defect of understanding, I say this) I am superior to them:

in toils more than they, in stripes more than they, in bonds more than they,

besides many other things, and the thronging around me every day, and my anxiety for all the churches.

Who becometh weak, and I become not weak? Who is stumbled, and I do not burn? If I must glory, I will glory in my infirmities.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Much love and the world's needs inspire us to pray for apostolic vocations. Because we are Catholics we treasure the priesthood; because we are Maronites we cherish a vision where priesthood is central to our faith. Beit Maroun is a monastic movement that originated with a priest of apostolic vision. The fountain of our traditions and observances is ascetic and monastic.

During these days of commemoration of the Holy Apostles we should stop to consider, honor, and imitate them in our lives.

The Christian Priesthood is especially cherished by the Maronite Church as our holy father was himself a priest, and ascetic and remote as his life may have been, his primary purpose (after the adoration of the Most High) was to bring the illumination of faith and healing grace to as many as possible. Before Lent, we have an entire week dedicated to all the deceased priests each year in recognition of this centrality to our Maronite and Catholic Faith.

What does it mean to be so profoundly touched by grace and faith that the communication of the Gospel becomes an imperative? Vocation haunts the men who receive it, and the gift of faith sets the human heart on fire to spread the tidings of life and grace to others. The Twelve Apostles are those who first received – touched, one might say³ – the Gospel directly from the Word Incarnate and who announced and spread the Good Tidings of life and salvation to all the world. They are the sowers and they are the seed, as it is beautifully stated in our Fenquitho.

In our parish, there is a quiet apostolic endeavor that has been engaged for many years now, in which families and individuals pray daily for the raising of sacerdotal vocations. This is being done through pilgrim icons of the Good Shepherd and prayer cards that are circulated weekly.⁴ Fundamentally grounded in hope, these prayerful individuals make appeal to the Lord of the Harvest that He fulfill His promise and send more laborers into His rich harvest.⁵

This simple and humble prayer for vocations participates in the apostolic work of the Church. Especially when it is consciously joined to others of like mind and fervor, these prayers share in the Church's apostolate. It participates in an apostolic work that seeks to communicate, maintain, and spread the redemptive grace of salvation.

This persevering prayer, and rotating ministry of the faithful, is both simple and powerfully efficacious. It is an unseen act of faith and charity. Its zeal may be simple, but it is a powerful work in devotion for the Church of God. The icons being used have been laid on the forgiving altar during the Offering of the Divine Eucharist, so they carry this sublime grace into the households where they travel and sanctify the homes where they come to rest week by week.

We Maronites have another great work to benefit the Catholic Priesthood; this is the **Order of Saint Sharbel**, which labors through its prayers and material aid to support seminarians and the retired priests. This is a noble enterprise in which every Maronite possible should be engaged. It supports the priests – the old, now in the radiance of holiness in their battle fatigue, and the young still in their seminary formation – who receive from some (the members of the Order) so as to bring redemption to many others in their lives' priestly vocation and work.

We must all together collaborate in hope and charity in order to dispose the ground and sustain the laborers so that the brilliance of the Sacred Heart might shine everywhere in the lives of all.

The continuous prayer for vocations is admirable in its efficacy and in its humble perseverance. *Generous souls are encouraged to sign up and expand the parish's apostolate of prayer and devotion;* they then join themselves to other grace-filled hearts that already commit themselves to the raising up of apostles in the next generations.

We pray for our sons so that they might become our fathers.

Understood correctly, those who commit themselves and animate this **parish apostolate of the vocation icon** become part of a privileged band of zealous souls who honor the Apostles by being themselves apostolic, by treasuring the apostolic faith, by communicating the apostolic traditions, and who develop in present prayer and sacrifice the future endeavors and ministry of the apostles to come.
