This Óay's Gospel¹ Saint Matthew 10: 1-7

He called His twelve disciples, giving them authority to drive out unclean spirits

and to heal every disease and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles:
The first of them was Simon, called Kepha, and his brother Andrew;
James, son of Zebedee, and his brother John;
Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, and Matthew, the publican;

James, son of *Alphai*, and *Lebba*, surnamed *Thadai*; Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Him.

Jesus sent out these twelve and commanded them, "Do not go among the pagans, nor enter any town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. As you go, proclaim, 'The Kingdom of Heaven has arrived'."

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

You are a Fire always burning,
but never consuming.
You are a Fire consuming in Your heat
all the soul's selfish love.
You are a Fire lifting all chill and giving light.
In Your light, You have made me know Your truth.
You are that Light beyond all light,
Who gives the mind's eye supernatural light
in such fullness and perfection
that You bring clarity even to the light of faith.
In that faith I see that my soul has life,
and in that light receives You Who are Light.

Things remaining the same can have varying effects in their actions depending on the disposition of the receiver. For example, the same sun can both melt wax and harden mud. Light can allow us to see so that we do not stumble when walking, and it can also cause pain and blindness to those whose eyes are weakened by sickness. The same heat can bring warm comfort and growth as well as burn up dried grass and cause forest fires. Fire can purify metals from dross and set ablaze that which is inflammably desiccated.

The presence of one and the same thing thus can have various effects depending on the recipient. So it is with God; He loves and sanctifies from an infinite Heart – even dying for us and conquering death – and yet not all are ultimately saved by that unique Love. It all depends on the disposition and condition of the receiver. Are we wax or mud? Does grace soften or harden our heart?

The above prayer of Saint Catherine of Siena bears a remarkable likeness to the image often used by the Syriac Fathers: God is Light and Fire. Profound in expression, it is an image that is easy to grasp, even if not to comprehend.

Saint Ephraim referred to the sun as an image of the Most Holy Trinity. Although the natural sun is not a revelation of the Triune Mystery of God, neither is the shamrock, but both have been used to express the Divine Mystery. The sun does hold a fitting symbolism for those who already know Divinity to be Threefold Personality as it has been revealed by our Savior. That said, the image remains an apt one to convey a fuller understanding of the works of God.

Saint Ephraim spoke of God as the Divine Sun in as much as the natural sun exhibits fire, heat, and light, so the Divine Trinity can be expressed threefold as Fire, Heat, and Light. The Logos illumines and for this reason is represented by the *light* of the sun, while the Spirit that enkindles the divine fire of charity within us is aptly referred to the *heat* of the natural sun. As light and heat originate in the solar fire, so the Divine Word and the Spirit of Holiness originate each from the *Divine Fire* that we call the Unseen Father. So the one sun – one light, one heat, one fire – speak to us of the One God: one Father, one Logos, and one Divine Spirit as Gift.

As we might find ourselves out in the natural cold – especially in Maine for much of the year – we can also find ourselves physically in shade, even in darkness at times. In our lives these physical conditions can suggest the spiritual realities of lack of charity, the obscurity of sin, and the disorienting darkness of selfish egocentrism. Sin can easily swamp us. Our "default settings" by birth into this fallen world are just that: cold, dark, and separated from God. Nevertheless, we have been created in the image of the Word Incarnate, and this means that each person is open to divine light and is "capable of God".

As noted in the prayer of Saint Catherine, the divine heat of grace is to consume our selfish love and turn us outwardly from our ego, thereby remedying our blindness. The divine fire is to enlighten us so that, transformed by faith, we can enter the perfection of the supernatural light. In this we come to a more profound and ever greater understanding of the one true God, ablaze in love.

Enlightened and enkindled in this manner, we are then disposed to "receive You Who are Light".



God did not become Man and die on Calvary so that we be made simply "good people". As Saint Catherine portrays so well in her prayer, Our God and Savior came into this world to transfigure us and make us transcend the merely natural and wounded life we received once at birth. This transcendent action is the meaning of "returning to Paradise" often repeated throughout the Great Fast.

Good education can make for "nice" people, but only grace, the true Faith, and the Divine Mysteries can make us the *children* of God. Only as divinized offspring can we enter the fullness of the Kingdom of Light.⁴

May we each form the desire to enter the spiritual vision and divine fire experienced by our Fathers and Mothers in the Faith. We move into the eternal Light so that the divine Heat may enkindle us, burn away our selfishness, and transfigure us progressively over the days of our lives.

Human life is an ongoing process to an end and a consummation. Grace gives it purpose and meaning. By the end of our days on earth, our

purified desire to enter the Divine Fire in blazing brilliance should find its perfection in the radiant fullness of the Kingdom.

Only on this path, and in this light, is the human heart able to find true rest.



The Fasc of the Doly Apostles

Saints Peter and Paul (June 29th) and the Twelve Apostles (June 30th)

Reminded by our Patriarch, it is our tradition to fast in preparation for the great feasts of Saints Peter and Paul, and all are encouraged to do so faithfully, *par*. 23:

This fast is known as "The Apostles' Fast", during which the faithful abstain from eating meat, dairy products, and eggs, from **June 21**st -- **28**th.5


We are reminded in *paragraph* 21 of the same letter that "a fast" is *to go without all foods from midnight to noon*, after which we abstain from all animal flesh and animal products – more or less "vegan" as one would call it today.

When a fast day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday (as will be the case on **June 24-25** this year) one can eat when they wish but should still abstain from all animal products, eggs,

and flesh. *Shellfish*, however, is permissible on Saturday and Sunday.

This practice is applicable to all who have *attained the age of the use of reason*, par. 22.
