Tbis Óay's Gospel¹ Saint Matthew 24: 21-31

For then there shall be great tribulation, such as has not occurred since the beginning of the world, nor shall ever happen again.

If those days were not shortened, no flesh would survive;

but for the sake of the elect those days shall be cut short.

At that time, if anyone says to you, "Look! The Messiah is here or there," do not believe it.
For false Messiahs shall arise, along with *the prophets of falsehood*, and they shall supply great signs

so as to deceive – if this were possible – even the elect.

Behold, I have told you ahead of time.

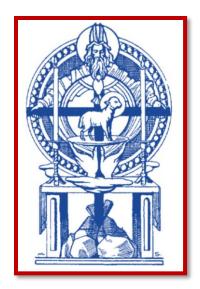
So if they tell you, "Look, he is in the desert", do not go out; or "Look, he is in an inner room", do not believe it.
For just as lightning goes out from the East and is visible as far as the West, so shall be the coming of the Son of Man.

Wherever the body is, there the eagles shall gather.

Immediately after the suffering of those days, the sun shall grow dark, and the moon shall not show its light. The stars shall fall from the sky and the powers of heaven shall be shaken.

At that time the sign of the Son of Man shall appear in the sky, and then all the generations of the earth shall mourn, and they shall see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky, with power and great glory.

He shall send out His angels with a great trumpet, and they shall gather His elect from the four winds, from one end of the heavens to the other.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

In prophecy, it is often the case that several realities, historical and otherwise, are telescoped. We considered this in last week's reflections. All creation and revelation is that of the ineffable divinity, the Hidden One. He communicates to us by nature and by revelation. All existence both in nature and in grace is meant to communicate the divine reality of the Creator and Origin of all. The Loveable One is made manifest through His epiphanic actions and creative work.

Among intelligent beings, men and angels, there is a further and more profound communication. God communicates *according* to *our* nature and thus speaks to us as it were in an intelligent and rational manner. He uses words, terms, culture, and historical concepts that men are able to grasp.

God communicates in human terms as it would be completely impossible for us to receive the Eternal Word in its infinite clarity and splendor.³ Because

of this, the Syriac Fathers saw all existence, nature and prophetic revelation, to be one, but in different modes and lessons directed toward one purpose and goal.

Everything has been created to manifest and glorify the Divine Goodness and, subsequent to the sinful fall of mankind, to bring redemption and return of all to God. Redemption requires that we be healed of our sins and our sinfulness, but *the purpose is union with God*. We must move supernaturally, transformed by grace, from the state of sin and alienation, toward union with the Living One.

Throughout the Old Testament, all things announce and foreshadow the coming of the Messiah. This prophetic word announced through *types* the coming of the true Presence of God in the Christ. The historical Jesus of Nazareth is the "Anointed", the Messiah, or in our Syriac, *m'sheeHo*, Who revealed that Presence to the world, and in so doing revealed the lovability of Hidden Goodness. As the Divine Word, the Second Person of the Trinity, Jesus is the fullness of God's communication to the world.

We are meant to live in that Presence and we are saved by that Presence through our incorporation into the Church – the extension in time and space of the Messiah. This prophetic mode lies at the heart of our Syriac love of *types* and *antitypes*, that is, in the foreshadowings of persons and events in the Old Law and in the Prophets that pointed to the Christ. This understanding grounds the poetry of our theology.

And yet in the Gospel, Our Lord speaks of a further manifestation when He will *return* "on the clouds of glory".⁴ This is less about a physical return as if travelling from one place to another, as if the Lord were now absent somehow, but is the **Parousia**,⁵ or the full manifestation of the Messianic Presence that is already among us, a presence hidden now but active in grace and in the Mystery of the Body of Christ.

The Parousia will shine like lightening in an instant and all created things will remain transfigured in that Light. The moment of epiphany will be the consummation of all things, and of time, a creature among creatures, which will also be transformed.

It is to this moment of epiphany, splendor, and revelation that all creation and all history are directed.

When the Compassionate One reveals Himself in all the radiance possible for creation to bear, then created time as we know it will end. This is what makes our Lord's "coming" the "Last Day". This is the meaning of "the powers of the heavens shall be shaken" when all creation will be transformed and renewed in the light of Christ.



Destruction and devastation are not the purpose of the Last Day, although it *will be the effect* in a natural world that is not disposed to receive grace and divine life. Our Lord said that He had come to give life and to give it more abundantly. Vitality, animation, and life will be given to all whether creation and men wish it or not, but it is only those previously disposed by grace who will receive the fullness of the gracious life of God, and only these will be able to enter the fullness of the Kingdom. All others will be animated by the presence of eternal life, but this vital force will be received in an oppositional and conflicted manner. Having been

previously rooted in mortally sinful choices, opposed to the life of grace, the damned will receive this divine life in oppositional hatred.

The catastrophic description of our Lord in the Gospel is not to announce fear, but to indicate the convulsions of a world that has been afflicted by original sin and that has rejected the saving grace of the Redeemer beforehand. Hence the horror of that long-expected Day when men will call to the mountains "to fall on us" as if they could hide from the glory of the Lord in His majesty.

The **indifference** of men and their willful **rejection** of grace that had been proposed to them in life are the reasons why there shall be such human and created tragedy within what is otherwise glorious: *the universal and cosmic triumph of the Christ in glory in His Manifestation*. The consequences for those willfully stubborn creatures will be eternal.

We now live in the "last days",⁹ the final age of creation as it awaits the fullness of redemption¹⁰ and the manifest presence and glory of the Compassionate One.

Wrath is the "other side" of scorned love. Divine justice is the effect of willfully rejected charity and grace. This is the result of the free choice made by men, for those who chose not to love correctly and justly.

While we have time, let us each seek this true life of God while it is now offered gently, compassionately, meekly, and with patient mercy. This is, after all, the true intent of God and His desire to love. *All creation and redemption are meant to be, after all, the revelation of the Sacred Heart.*

When we embrace that grace, and receive that redemption; when we confess well our sins before the All Holy, we are reoriented to union with Triune Charity in the intimacy of gracious friendship. Could there be anything more beautiful?

This year, the second Sunday of October, the 8th, is designated as "The Order of Saint Sharbel Sunday". We should seriously consider joining this admirable organization that aids in the training of seminarians and the maintenance of the old priests who have served well their years in the Vineyard of the Lord.



The Order was founded in 1980 by parishioners and priests of multiple parishes, as a response to Archbishop Francis Zayek's plea for help for the Seminary.

The Order of St. Sharbel is dedicated to our priests: past, present, and future. This is an organization of laypeople and clergy who have pledged their spiritual strength and their financial support to educate our Maronite seminarians, pay the operating costs of the Maronite Seminary in Washington, and to support a dignified retirement for our priests who have finished their services to the Lord in the expansion of His Kingdom.

Our seminarians study at Our Lady of Lebanon Maronite Seminary in Washington, D.C., the only Maronite seminary outside Lebanon. Having a Seminary in the United States is a sign of permanence of the Maronite Church in America, and brightly signifies a new chapter, an American chapter, in the history of Beit Maroun.

Founded in 1961, our seminary continues to play a vital role in educating our priests. The Order is the largest contributor to the seminary, covering over half of its costs each year. The seminarians we support today will be the priests of tomorrow that will serve us and preserve our Maronite Church in America. They are destined to be the apostolic sons of our beloved Father.

The Order holds its annual meeting in conjunction with the <u>National Apostolate</u> of Maronites Convention. Members are distinguished by the cross and ribbon they wear whenever the Bishop is present. They serve as his official Honor Guard.

In the past few years, there has been a great renewal of interest in the Order, and there are now hundreds who support

the Maronite apostolic endeavor in this way. But new recruits are always welcome.

When he canonized Saint Sharbel on October 9, 1977, Pope Paul VI emphasized the role of the family in fostering vocations to the priesthood. The financial support for our seminarians depends on the generosity of our Church family, of which you are a member.
