

For thus it is right for me to think of you all, because ye are permanently in my heart, and because, both in my bonds and in the vindication of the truth of the Gospel, ye are my associates in grace.

For God is my witness, how I love you in the heart of Jesus *Messiah*. –

And for this I pray, that your love may still increase and abound, in knowledge, and in all spiritual understanding: so that ye may discern the things that are suitable; and may be pure and without offence, in the Day of the Messiah, and be full of fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus *the Messiah*, to the praise and glory of God.

And I would that ye might know, my brethren, that the transaction in regard to me, hath eventuated rather for the furtherance of the Gospel; so that my bonds, on account of the Messiah, are manifested in all the court, and to all others.

And many of the brethren in our Lord have become confident, on account of my bonds, and more bold to speak the word of God without fear. -And they proclaim (it), some from envy and contention; but others with good will, and with love for the Messiah.

#### **ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS**

The New Law, for Law there is, is first and foremost the Person of Christ, His Doctrine, and His life itself, which teach us to live as children of God. It is more concretely the Holy Spirit Whom He sends to us and Who suggests to us from within

the mentality and the morality of children of God.3

Who doesn't like a party? Human beings get in line and gather with others in celebration without always knowing what they are doing. Play now, ask later.

Exuberance: it's the spirit of the crowds meeting Our Lord outside of Bethphage. The feeling is understandable; this is the great Rabbi of Nazareth, Miracle-Worker, Compassionate, but curiosity is also a motive among the crowds. This is the One Who raised Lazarus from the dead just a few weeks beforehand. They come to see it all. *Curiosity*. This is the Man Whom the authorities wish to arrest. *Curiosity*.

Any way, it's a party, so join the crowd! *Hosanna*! How quickly that jubilation will give way to shouts of "Crucify Him!" in a few days' time.

We know that the Gospel tells us that in the midst of this exuberance Our Lord wept. He knew what was in the heart of man.<sup>4</sup> Being God, he could clearly see that for most among these crowds the inner heart and the outer actions were not the same.<sup>5</sup> This is the path of Great Lent as we collaborate with grace to become fully integrated both within and without, a whole person with integrity. For many in these crowds, the reality within their minds did not correspond with the outward jubilation, and this disharmony would be echoed in the coming destruction of the Holy City. Left alone, curiosity, exuberance, and unguided feelings bring death and destruction.

The whole purpose of Our Lord's mission was to restore that supernatural love to creation which had been lost through the ingratitude of Adam and Eve. Love is the *rule* of the Gospel; and, yes, there is a "law" in the Gospel (this product *did* come with instructions and directions). It would be "so easy" if it were otherwise, but true love does not consist in vague feelings and sentimentality: *If you love Me, you will keep My commandments.*<sup>6</sup>

Love, as Scripture says, is as strong as death and a blazing fire.<sup>7</sup> It has purpose, strength, and perseverance. Grace is present to reorient our spirits and hearts to God Incarnate and to attach us completely to the Person of Christ, *Msheeho* – the New Law Incarnate. Committed to this Person we become open to His teaching and His life; we become docile to the working of the Divine Spirit within us. Love brings subtlety and keen attention to the Hidden God of power and might. We imitate because we love. Love transforms us because it is a true power from the Hidden Good One, and not mere "feelings" originating from within us. Charity moves us from being idle and curious spectators to engaged lovers.

And *our* heart? The things we treasure point to its place. The path to heaven is not possessions or pleasure, this we already know, but is found in a

*Person*: the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Our "hosannas" must be more than once or twice a year, lest we, too, be only curiosity seekers inspired by self-interest, cheering as we meander along a directionless path that leads to destruction, death, and damnation.

Where lie our hearts and to what are they attached? For where your treasure is, there also shall be your heart.8





# The Traditional and Patriarchal Norms for the Great Fast

- A.) Although all the days of Lent are traditionally fast days, special effort is to be put in to observe fully the first and last weeks of the holy season: the week of Ash Monday and Great and Holy Week.
- B.) Ash Monday and the First Week of Great
  Lent and Great Week of the Passion and
  especially Great and Holy Friday of the
  Crucifixion through to noon on Saturday
  of the Great Light are Days of Fast and
  Abstinence according to our traditions.
- C.) For all, as a minimum requirement according to the sacred canons, we must <u>fast</u> on Ash Monday and on Good Friday.

  <u>Abstinence</u> must be observed on all Fridays of Great Lent. The days of fast and those of abstinence are strictly to be free of all flesh meats.

- D.) From the <u>age of reason</u> onward, all are obliged to follow the abstinence from all meat, meat products, and dairy products on these fast days.
- E.) All Wednesdays and Fridays throughout the year are traditional days of fast and abstinence from all meat and dairy products.
- F.) In general, the sick, expectant mothers, those involved in heavy labor or exertion, and the elderly who need to eat regularly are exempted from fasting and abstinence, especially those who are under medical care for chronic illnesses.
- G.) <u>Saturdays</u> and <u>Sundays</u> in the eastern traditions are not days of fasting as are the weekdays.
  - 1.) Traditionally, abstinence is still observed from all meat and meat products, from all dairy products, eggs, and from fish.
  - 2.) Traditional mitigation on Saturday and Sunday does allow for the consuming of shellfish and wine (or other alcohol).
  - 3.) There is no fast restriction of time. One may eat at any hour.
  - 4.) In its celebration, fish may be eaten on Sha'neenee (Hosanna Sunday/Palm Sunday)
- H.) Breaking the Fast is permitted also on the following feastdays:
  - 1.) Saint John Maron (March 2);
  - 2.) The Forty Martyrs (March 9);
  - 3.) Saint Patrick (March 17th);
  - 4.) Saint Joseph (March 19th); and,
  - 5.) The Annunciation (March 25th).

**QUANTITY**: In our tradition, the weekday fast means no food whatsoever between midnight and noon, only water and medication are permitted.

QUALITY: Also, in our traditional eastern tradition, the days of fast are in practice more or less vegan, that is, no meat, no seafood, no meat products, no dairy products, and no eggs are eaten.




