

## TOÓAY'S EDISTLE Hebrews 12: 18-24

(17. You know that later, when he [Esau] wished to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no chance to repent, even though he sought the blessing with many tears.)

You have not approached something that could be touched, to a blazing fire and gloomy darkness and storm, and a trumpet blast and a voice speaking words such that those who had heard begged that no

message be further addressed to them, for they could not bear to hear the command:

If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned (to death).

Indeed, so fearful was the spectacle that Moses himself said, "I am terrified and trembling". No, you have approached Mount Zion and the City of the Living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to countless angels in festal gathering,

and before the **assembly of the firstborn** enrolled in Heaven,

and to God – the Judge of All – and to the **spirits of the just made perfect**,

and to Jesus, the Mediator of the New Covenant, and to the sprinkled Blood that speaks more eloquently than that of Abel.

(25. See that you do not refuse the One Who is speaking to you: for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the One Who warns us from heaven! [26.] At that time His voice shook the earth, but now He has promised:

Yet once more I will shake not only the earth, but also the heavens.)



## **ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS**

The absolute quality of the Pauline enunciations shows that the freedom in question is not simply virtue .... It is the Christian life itself in one's soul, its source and its mode of being, in its most formal aspects: the Holy Spirit, the Grace of God, the Charity of Christ.

Beauty is **unity in diversity**, a harmonious whole that is perceived by the mind intellectually. Like the many petals in a single flower, or in the variety of tones united in a symphony, beauty is an underlying wholeness within a diversity of things. This unity is often inexpressible, ineffable, and when discovered in magnitude or in an object that is majestic – such as a mountain range – it causes a sense of awe.

Beauty is the purpose of creation. The Divinity pours forth existence and life so that Eternal Goodness might be made manifest outside Itself, and, in turn, be shared in by creation itself. All creatures participate in this Goodness to one degree or another, and the vast variety of being and goodness all in one "cosmos" exemplifies the very definition of created

beauty. This is why *Genesis* portrays the Creator as commenting at the end of each "day" of creation that it was "good". But when the author arrives at the end of the Sixth Day, when all is complete, he writes that God said, "It is *very* good". Existence and life are good in themselves, but the functioning of the whole in harmony is "very good".

The world does not exist for any individual creature, but for all. And as much as modern man would have it otherwise, it is not the individual upon whom the sun rises and sets. Understanding this instills humility and a proper understanding of each our places in the cosmos. Things are *the way they are*, and perhaps not the way I would wish them to be.

As we all know, the basic definition of psychosis is the illness of a mind that does not see or correspond with reality – the way things actually are. In a profoundly true sense the modern era is one of insanity and unhealthy mental hygiene. There is a modern attempt to redefine everything, especially in morals, rather than enter into the beautiful details of how things actually are in their diverse natures.

They only thing that has "disturbed" this natural harmony was the entrance of the Eternal One into time. This event finished by the eruption of a New Creation in the Resurrection. This disruption in history must be correctly understood, however, as it had always been the intent of the Creator to enter personally into creation. Mankind, *adom*, after all, had been created as a reflection of this eternally foreseen moment. Each human being has been created in the image of the Word Incarnate.

Looked at from this perspective, the Bright One came to perfect in a unique way what could only be limited in its existence. Our Lord God and Savior, the Messiah, came among us to reveal both the Hidden One to us and what we are meant to be as human beings. He is wholly God and wholly Man, therefore we find our perfection in likeness to Him, much as a painting will be "perfect" to the degree that it corresponds to the original idea of the artist. Nevertheless, the Divine Image being infinite, we can only be conformed to its perfection by grace.

This is the "likeness" spoken of in *Genesis* where it is stated that *adom* was created in the "image" and

"likeness" of God. By the rejection and self-assertion of *adom* in Paradise this "likeness" and friendship with the Divine were lost. Now wounded, mankind had to wait the day of restoration by the One Whom he had "unfriended" in the Garden.

The restored friendship is grace and holiness: the reintegration of transcendent and the temporal elements in human life. This wholeness, ordering, and well-being is called *shlomoh*. Note once again that the first goal of Christianity is not to make men morally "good", it is to make them "holy".

The saints are those who have discovered the fundamental beauty of what it means to be human: to be conformed to the Holy One born in Bethlehem. When we give priority in our lives to what is purely natural – jobs, school, shopping, career, recreation, etc. - we distort our existence. With a purely horizontal view, we become lopsided. Only when we place the divine at the center of our lives do we become fully balanced and healthy according to the original creative intent. This is not a quantitative question but a qualitative one; what holds first importance in our lives? The Faith and grace? Or is it rather in our mundane obligations and earthly concerns? The proper balance of the natural and supernatural orders in our lives is what brings about the *unity in diversity* that is beauty joining both the temporal and transcendent.

Only the saints and the righteous, thus, are fully human, because it is only they who are fully conformed to the Divine Reality in which men were created. All others are deficient, wounded, and lost to the degree that they lack this transformative grace. The modern scourges of loneliness, addiction, morbid obesity, violence, disease, and mental instability are only symptoms of a much deeper problem: the absence of healing grace and illuminative splendor. Human life lacking this healing grace remains fundamentally human, but it falls short of its original destiny: the reflected unity of the One Image, radiant from the Hidden Father.<sup>2</sup>

Discover all this, and we discover true beauty. Discover this, and we unveil what it is to be fully alive. Discover this, and we fall in love with the Eternal Lover and infinite Beauty.

When all is said and done, the saints are no different from the rest of us, *except* that they have seen what it is to be completely human because they have seen Beauty and have fallen in love. Having opened themselves to Eternal Charity, they have been transformed into the fullness of what it is to be human.

They have entered the City of the Living God.
