THIS DAY'S GOSPEL St. John 21: 15-19

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these?"

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Monday, May 7th, will be the anniversary date of your servant's arrival at Saint Joseph's here in Waterville. As I have mentioned to some already, the first year of apostolate has been to do homilies on the Gospels throughout the twelve months. Although we are not completely to the end of the first calendric year, we are at the end of the year liturgically. Last year, I arrived on the Fourth Sunday of Easter.

This second year will be to concentrate on the first readings, or "the epistles of Saint Paul" as they are usually termed. Note, however, that they are not always from Saint Paul. These homilies may prove more difficult as the Epistles are not always simple and direct. Human nature being what it is, their histories can be complicated, but the teaching is magnificent. Over a period of two years then, these homilies will allow us to consider together the sacred texts as the whole basis of our life as Catholics and lay a good foundation for the third year in which, God willing, we will examine in depth the Divine Liturgy and the Sacred Mysteries.

Thus, from next week onward, the text that will appear in the bulletin will be that of the Epistle instead of the Gospel. As ever, both readings for each Sunday will continue to be recorded in the schedule of readings.


