ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Being constantly exposed to the danger of shipwreck in the sea of this world,

we ask the martyrs to accompany us with their prayers on the difficult way.

Then, like them, we shall reach the Port of Salvation and share in the eternal joy of the Kingdom of God, glorifying and praising Him forever.³

We are often buffeted and shaken during our journey in life. The unexpected, the undesired, and failures can upend our world so easily. Only the immutability of the Divine can stabilize our lives and heal our wounds, and the deeper that grace penetrates our being the more profound our existence becomes, then anchored in God the greater is our peace. In effect, salvation means that we are to become by grace what God is by nature.

In a decided pattern, Saint Luke lays out in the Sacred Texts the life of the faithful disciples of the Word Incarnate. When the faithful have their lives properly ordered and disciplined under grace their labor, infused with the Divine Spirit, will flow richly and harmoniously outward from their Spirit-filled communion with God. From devoted prayer, to the reception of the Spirit, the supernatural effort and action become the response to obedience and charity in the Messiah.

Infused contemplation is a pure gift of God; the deeper the discipline of prayer, the more that life will be firmly rooted within the divine sphere, and the more the theological virtues of faith, hope, and charity will flourish. Progress in pursuing God does not consist in enjoying Him more – that would be self-centered – but in doing His will more completely. Pray well, and we flourish in the service of God. He guides all; we must learn to follow.

So it is that a prayerful parish will be a reservoir of the Spirit of God from which will pour out brilliant grace and life to others. Prayer must be primary, for from this a fruitful life will flow. And to accomplish great apostolic work, we must first desire and choose goals that are truly great. We must be **magnanimous**.

As a "parish" we are a community of "travelers" and we voyage together in the same vessel for a certain moment in time.

The recent intervention made to the CDC has upset many, disturbed our course, rocked the boat as it were, but it has not dampened our enthusiasm to move forward as a parish. Perhaps, in the end, we will be even stronger for it. We look to the Harbor of Salvation and trust in divine aid, in spite of anyone's misguided actions.

We work whole heartedly for the common good of Maine, especially with health in mind and spirit in the forefront. Our intent is the full healing of all. Humbled, we are not laid low: the path of Christ will always be a journey of humility.

So for now we have had to institute a second "overflow" Mass on Sundays. This we must continue to do for the foreseeable future, allowing as many of our parishioners to attend the Divine Mysteries still on the morning of the Lord's Day, the great Ogdoad. We count on fifty persons at each Mass. The numbering at times can be difficult because many of those attending are in fact related, co-habitating, family members. We do what we reasonably can do, and may God be served in all things through our small efforts.

Thank you for your understanding and patience as we ride out this rocking of our parochial vessel. All things pass, God alone endures. This too shall pass, but for now we must stabilize the course.

May the Good One reward you all for adapting readily to this new situation in such an admirable manner. However, this set-up is clumsy as the Masses are rammed back-to-back. The intervening time between the two Qourboneh is too congested to properly disinfect the pews and missals, and it does not easily allow the parishioners who are departing and those who are arriving to do so smoothly. To foster a better crowd flow, please enter by the *Front Street* entrance, but exit by the *Appleton Street* door.

To allow for easier attendance, more efficient disinfecting, and better access to the Mystery of Penance we must tweak this present Sunday schedule.

Beginning next Sunday, <u>September 13th</u>, the Sunday Masses will be scheduled for <u>9:00</u> and <u>11:00</u>. Confessions will be heard before both Liturgies, as usual.

Please continue to keep the balanced attendance as we are now, and were last week -50/50 – first come first served to be able to attend,⁴ safely

distanced. This will certainly last at least until the state elevates the acceptable capacity for indoor gatherings. The gatherings for muffins and coffee are also awaiting this same decision.

You are to be congratulated for these last months of smooth sailing, the recent upset was certainly a disappointment, but we are, I am sure, all undeterred to serve the Lord God in all His ways – in both the smooth and the rough paths. Choppy seas should not disrupt our life of prayer, and disappointments should not disrupt our course. We look to serve the Good One by accomplishing His will more completely. He will supply the rest.

Together, let us move forward toward the Hidden One of majesty, unseen, but always present. He calls us into the Harbor of Salvation and peace.

Circumstances will indicate our future course. For now, our eyes are turned to the Parousia, from which we can hope the enlightening of our minds, the consolation of our hearts, the strengthening of our spirits, the infusion of radiant grace into our very bodies, as we await, with open face, the manifestation of Lord Who is Spirit.

May the unseen Weaver of Crowns bless you all for your faith, charity, and sense of mutual aid and charitable collaboration as we support one another in this "difficult way".

The Life-giving Cross

Please, take notice of our present practices:

- 1.) All Catholics, of whatever Ritual Church, are more than welcome at Saint Joseph. We are all one Body of Christ.
- 2.) During this pandemic, there is no obligation to assist at the Divine Sacrifice.
- 3.) Those who are sick, or carry symptoms of sickness, must remain at home.
- 4.) All are recommended to give contact information (a list is provided at the door) in order to inform you if need arise from a case of the virus. All information remains *confidential* to the *parish* and is not transferred to any state agency.

- All vulnerable, elderly, and at-risk 5.) individuals should remain at home and follow the Liturgies as posted on the parish's website.
- The Sunday Vigil Masses are suspended 6.) until further notice.
- All who are retired, or who may have a freer weekday schedule, are asked to consider assisting at Mass during the weekdays, Tues-Fri, 9:00am; and on Saturday at 10:00am. This would free up more room on Sunday for those who must work during the normal workweek.
- 8.) Please *do not use your hands* to cover sneezes and coughs. Everyone must wear a face-mask to safely control and cover all coughs, sneezes, congestion, etc.
- Hand sanitizers are available at the 9.) entrances and at the confessional.
- 10.) Seating at church must be "first-comefirst-served". Seating will be closed at "50".
- 11.) Everyone must sit in such a way that there is *no one immediately in front* of them and *no* one immediately behind them.
- 12.) Everyone will need to *charitably assist* one another to sit throughout the entire church, occupying all pews while respecting "physical distancing".
- 13.) To control crowd flow, **doors** will be **locked** at the beginning of each Liturgy.
- 14.) A *six-foot distancing* must be observed by those who approach the Divine Altar and wish to receive the Divine Eucharist in Holy Communion.
- 15.) And, lastly, at the end of Mass, those who wish to remain and pray in the church are welcome to do so, but all others are asked not to *linger and visit within the church*. If one wishes to visit, please do so outside the church, being mindful of the proper physical distancing.
