So then, my beloved, obedient as you have always been, not only when I am present but all the more now when I am absent, work out your salvation with fear and trembling. For God is the One Who, for His good purpose, works in you both to desire and to work.

Do everything without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine like stars in the world, as you hold on to the word of Life, so that my boast on the day of Christ may be that I did not run in vain or labor in vain.

But, even if I am poured out as a libation over the sacrificial offering of your faith, I rejoice and share my joy with all of you.

In the same way, you also should be glad and rejoice with me.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Not only the initial gift of love is of celestial origin (|| Thess 2: 10) but every increase of this charity can only be obtained by divine favor....1

In the modern world, if one thinks of salvation at all, it is often with the idea that it is attained on our own volition, or even, that it simply "happens because God is good". Often this may happen, but it is not Christianity. The healing of the human spirit and the restoration of human life as it had been intended in Paradise - Salvation - is a divine gift and freely given by the Hidden One of compassion. One cannot merit salvation. One cannot enter the Beatific Vision ("Heaven") on one's own. To hold a contrary opinion is heresy and was already argued over, intensely, and condemned in the fourth century. This erroneous doctrine is called "Pelagianism", and Pope Benedict XVI even before he was Pontiff called attention to its resurgence as a predominant error and stumbling block to the modern world.

Salvation is completely and entirely a gift of God. It is merited, in truth, only by the life, death and resurrection of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ. For the rest of us, we are given the *possibility* to share in this work through the Faith and the Divine Mysteries. Once we are in the state of grace we must pray daily that God increase and develop the supernatural life within us.

This is the meaning in today's Reading where Saint Paul writes that "for His good purpose", God is the One Who works in us "both to desire and to work". God initiates therapeutic salvation, fosters its growth, and brings it to fruition.

For these reasons, Saint Augustine stated that when God *rewards* the saints, He does nothing other than *crown* His own work. While Our Lord in strict justice does merit the salvation of the world by His Death on Calvary, the saints "merit" Heaven in an analogous manner, that is, it is in *collaborating* with God's work by grace that they enter into divine life.

This Catholic vision is completely other than the many modern one prevailing such as "getting to Heaven on one's own", "being nice is sufficient" or that by simply dying one goes "to a better place". These may be contemporary notions in which some find consolation, but they are not Christian ones.

On the contrary, Saint Paul makes it clear today that salvation is obtained through effort in *collaboration* with the One Who works in us. Salvation requires a collaborative effort with this Hidden God, in which we must "run" and "labor". In the end – using sacrificial images – poured out as a sacrifice at the divine altar, Saint Paul has confidence that the "offering" of our faith will lead us to the joy of the Divine Light. It all requires effort.

We all desire "the crown", so we must pray daily for the grace and aid from God to both "desire" and to "work" within the transformative grace of the Resurrection.

Let us strive to do as the saints before us: to shine like stars in the "midst of a crooked and perverse generation" – and be ever grateful for having the opportunity to do so.
