ΤοόλΥ'S EDISTLE Ephesians 2: 1-10

You were dead through the transgressions and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient.

All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of the flesh and its impulses; and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else.

But God, Who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ – by grace you have been saved – and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to

come He might show the immeasurable riches of His grace in His kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing: it is the gift of God – not the result of works – so that no one may boast. For we are His handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared beforehand to be our way of life.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

Henceforth, we know the constitutives and the nature of this sovereign liberty.

It is the essence of a filial morality.

Only those who have God for their Father are truly free.

This liberty is matured by the Holy Spirit who frees us progressively from inherited servitudes.

Good morals, when we are immature, begin with law (learning "the rules"), they improve by becoming "second nature" as we mature so that we act in an honorable and virtuous way not simply because "we must", but because they define the actions of the mature. Our actions express who we are. Yet they do not become "perfect" (and dispositive of entrance into the Kingdom of God at death) until they are performed as second nature *originating in filial love*, that is, inspired by divine charity. Anything less than this is a deficiency for the children of God.

Should we follow this path and allow its direction to lead our lives, we will arrive at holiness, become true disciples of Our Lord, and, finally, be made selfless in holiness as the offspring of the Good One.

Rules make us "obedient" as children; maturing in discipline, good action makes us "virtuous" in our youth; and with mature age, along with wisdom,

virtue when transformed by divine charity we are made "holy".

Only love can make us truly free. To the degree that charity is absent from the motivation of our daily actions we are all the less virtuous and less free before the Holy One.

Because we must consciously break with our sins, faults, and even our bad habits – all the forms of servitude in human life – this is challenging; but the development is always possible as grace permeates our lives. It is the reason that Saint Paul often repeated that the Divine Spirit, the Promise of the Father and the Power from on High, has been given to believers.

All the same, it does make one stop and consider the magnitude and the importance of our actions. We only have one life in which to do these things. We must make every day have value toward the goal. Grace gives purpose and meaning, and to live apart from Christ is death.² Christians may live in a fallen world where ignorance, confusion, and darkness make inroads too often, but we are also bathed in the light of grace even as we approach judgement.

As Saint Peter once wrote, if judgement begins in the house of God, and *we* find it a challenge to be faithful, how much more stringent will it be for those who are without?³
