Toòλy's Epistle Hebrews 7: 11-19

If, then, perfection came through the Levitical priesthood, on the basis of which the people received the Law, what need would there still have been for another priest to arise according to the order of Melchizedek, and not reckoned according to the order of Aaron?

When there is a change of priesthood, there is necessarily a change of law as well.

Now He of Whom these things are said belonged to a different tribe, of which no member ever officiated at the altar. It is clear that our Lord arose from Judah, and in regard to that tribe Moses said nothing about priests.

It is even more obvious if another priest is raised up after the likeness of Melchizedek, who has become so, not by a law expressed in a commandment concerning physical descent, but by the power of a life that cannot be destroyed. For it is testified:

You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

On the one hand, a former commandment is annulled because of its weakness and uselessness, for the Law brought nothing to perfection; on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

A love of beauty and of generosity can only give rise to happiness.

Joy is the response to possessing a good. This is a bit abstract, perhaps, but all that it means is that when we are in the presence of something good, something that we love, we have an emotional response that is called "joy". In the Scriptures, the verb that corresponds to the noun *agapé* (charity) most often signifies "to be content, satisfied, happy". It is often associated with "rejoicing".

Note that joy is not "exuberance" or "exultation," and although they are often confused they are not the same. When they *are* mixed up then those who do not feel exuberant often think themselves not to be joyful. This is altogether false. One can be exuberant without joy (think Friday night at the bar) and one can be joyful without exuberance (think Saint Sharbel in his hermitage).

Joy has depth, exuberance is outward expression. Joy brings contentedness and peace. Exuberance fosters noise and commotion. The person who is truly joyful is one who treasures the present good, and loves what they possess. Joy is most often quiet.

Exuberance is always loud. Joy can express itself in tears; exuberance never.

The joy of Christmas is one of knowledge and possession. It is the *knowledge* that the Divine Word has expressed Himself to us in these the last days through the womb of the most-holy Virgin. It is *possession*, because we have been offered – and have received – that divine Gift by grace and faith. So long as we have the Faith, and live in the state of God's grace, we possess the Eternal One made Man for our salvation. This is true joy.

This kind of joy is supernatural, of course, and often we "feel" it especially around the beauty of Christmas celebrations, but it is important to keep in mind that it is ongoing reality that we are supposed to possess all throughout the year.

Joy is what centers and lends depth to beatitude – our happiness as Catholics. As we possess by grace the infinite One of all consolation, the Eternal Light, the Creator-Word, the expression of this joy is strictly speaking ineffable – "unspeakable". Hence, this joy, as is it directed and rooted in the Hidden Light, is rather a participation in the happiness of heaven than it is in the mere temporal happiness of this earth. Christian joy is already a stable participation in the beatitude of God. Understood this way, joy lends *gravitas* to a life transformed by grace: know what we love, treasure it, and imitate what we have found.

In the end, the joy of the glorious Birth of the Messiah is something that can hardly be expressed, nevertheless it can be lived; and it is in living this joy that we become the "face of Christ" and manifest the reality of faith to those around us. This is the manner in which the Gospel has always been spread: person to person in supernatural joy.

What a perfect resolution for the new year of grace!
