# THIS DAY'S GOSPEL St. John 2; 1-11

On the third day there was a marriage at Cana in Galilee, and the Mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the marriage, with His disciples. When the wine failed, the Mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what has this to do with you and Me? My hour has not yet come."

His Mother said to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you."

Now six stone jars were standing there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.

Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward of the feast."

So they took it.

When the chief steward of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Every man serves the good wine first; and when men have drunk freely, then the poor wine, but you have kept the good wine until now."

This was the first of His signs that Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested His glory.

And His disciples believed in Him.



# ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

"I do not promise you happiness in this world, but in the next."

This quotation is shocking at first glance, but when we know that it is a statement made by the holy Mother of God to Saint Bernadette at Lourdes1 it becomes more palatable even if it still remains extraordinarily abrupt to our modern ears. Here we have the ever-Virgin Mary not conforming to our all too often sentimental vision of religion. Of course, to add to our shock, all we have to do is remember that during the famous apparitions in 1858 the young girl was also directed to dig in the mud with her bare hands, eat grass and wash her face with the muddy water. This same water went on to heal many who later bathed in them, but at the time of the apparitions it was only humiliating, so much so that at the end of that specific apparition Saint Bernadette's aunt slapped her in public for having done such a disgraceful embarrassing thing. How much this would have added to young Bernadette's public humiliation!

This is all mystifying – and confusing to some – unless we come to understand a central teaching of the Gospel: he who seeks his life will lose it,<sup>2</sup> and

blindness and confuses judgment.

he who loses his life for the sake of Christ will find it.<sup>3</sup>

So it is that we arrive at the beginning of another Great Fast, Lent. While the word "lent" only means "Spring" in old English, it is "fast" that names the determination of this annual season. "Fast", also from an older form of English, means "strength" as we see in the word that still exists today in English: "steadfast". What is meant by "fast" is not *starve yourself*, but rather *strengthen yourself*. The fasting norms for Maronite Catholics can be found in the *Maronite Voice* that is available at the doorways of the church.

When we fast we choose primarily to set our minds in focus on the important things in life, extricate ourselves from the shackles of our sins and selfishness, and to elevate our lives by cooperating with divine grace: not to be caught unawares by the moment of death when it shall all be too late.

We die the way we live.

Among other things, the Great Fast is our annual tithe<sup>4</sup> of time for each year. We reserve seven weeks of the fifty-two to set our minds on the seriousness of what it is to be the children of God and disciples of the Light. It is completely in line with our vocation as Maronites following the ascetic path in the spirit of the *ihidoyoutho*.<sup>5</sup>

During this Lent we will also initiate the adult instruction evening on Wednesdays. These will begin in March and will be referred to as MCF: "Maronite Catholic Formation". They will follow a more or less normal academic schedule, October through May, once begun. It will be for adults

only, no children,6 and will allow us to range over the beauty of the Catholic Christian Faith as lived in the Syriac Maronite tradition. As a text, we will use <u>Captivated by Your Teachings</u> by Fr. Anthony Salim, and while we do have a few copies on hand, you can also find a copy for yourself beforehand on the web or through a bookseller.

In the end, Lent is an annual reminder that we were not created for this world, beautiful as some of it parts may be. Being created in the divine Image and restored by the free choice of divine Charity, our destiny is meant to transcend the world here below. As we are meant to be the transformed children of God in Light eternal, let us then become serious about our human lives here below and make them collaboratively transformed by grace and by the love of our Lord God and Savior, and conformed to the Gospel of Christ.

In serious attitude, let us set ourselves to make this an excellent Lent of resolution, determination and fidelity. Only then will we be able to fully trust that the ever-Virgin Mother of God will make us, too, happy in the world to come.
