TOÓλY'S EDISTL Romans 7: 1-6

Do you not know, brethren – for I am speaking to those who know the law – that the law is binding on a person only during that person's lifetime? Thus, a married woman is bound by the law to her husband as long as he lives; but if her husband dies, she is discharged from the law concerning the husband. Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she consorts with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man, she is not an adulteress.

In the same way, my friends, you have died to the Law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to Another: to Him Who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. While we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the Law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death.

But now we are released from the Law, dead to that which held us captive, so that we are slaves not under the obsolete letter, but in the newness of the Spirit.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

The Savior came to free men from all servitude and, in order to do this, He proposed to them the Truth.

Satan holds men in slavery and, in order to do this, he keeps them under the lie.

And, just as the devil – a murderer from the beginning – willed to kill Jesus, his "sons" seek always to snuff out the light and to massacre the witnesses to the Truth.²

The basis of Christian freedom is adherence to a Person. To become a disciple – "one who learns" – of Christ is to follow and adhere to Him. Not firstly an adherence to a "creed" or set of beliefs, it is by personal engagement that we receive Truth and walk in the Light toward final liberation.

Existence and birth are something "done to" us, but *shlomoh* and eternal Life are things to which we respond and toward which we move. Christianity is based on the personal response to grace followed by "faith" in the Person of the Word Incarnate, the Messiah, Our Lord Jesus Christ.

To explain the citation above, it must be noted that those who live according to whim, primarily according to their "feelings" and emotions – that is, those who firstly cherish their isolating self-centered existence – live in servitude to those whims and sinful caprices. Those who cherish their servitude are never able to tolerate the existence of those who have escaped from that self-enclosing life, those who have escaped "darkness". Understanding this it is easy for us to see why our Lord spoke of persecutions for His disciples. It was not fearmongering or depressing "negativism"; it was simply to note the psychology of human beings.³

"Misery loves company", and the miserable insist that everyone be such. Perhaps this explains in large part why there was an ovation in the New York legislature two weeks ago when they passed a law to allow the killing of children in the womb up until the day of their birth. An "ovation"? God have mercy on us all for the selfish world being created. Misery and darkness are its origin and the air it breathes.

May the Lord God, the Good One, give each of us the strength to move away from judgments based on personal expediency, away from sin, and enter radically and perseveringly along the path of Incarnate Wisdom, toward liberation and ultimate, permanent, freedom. Come what may.


