ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

In last week's Gospel of Saint Matthew, our Lord forewarned us of the darkness of spirit and deception which is called "anti-Christ". Three centuries later, Saint Augustine, in his second book of The City of God, pointed out that a people schooled in the religious life and the illumination of the Gospel, who belong to a community of memory, bound together in common service, and who share a common hope, can tell the difference between serving the one true God, faithfully, and bowing down before idols. As our Lord often stated in His teachings: "Behold, I have told you beforehand." Forewarned, we are forearmed.

Community is established by the relationships among its members, and this is the fundamental sense of *jus³ -- equity and "law"*. Law is not so much something written in books and enforced by police, it is the primarily the balanced interrelation between members of a given community. For a Christian people, this "lawful" balanced and equitable correspondence between the members of a society is further perfected by its elevation in grace through the Gospel. In a well ordered society, everyone has a value, purpose, and place within it. As a person created in the image and likeness of God, no one is to be cast off or rejected as without value; and no individual should be subordinated to the wants, desires, or whims of another.

Saint Augustine goes on to explain that this justice, *jus*, can only take the form of the defense of the Church – the City of God as it exists on pilgrimage, being the providential *locus* of the Hidden One's full revelation – which is both a social fact as well as an eschatological sign.⁴

The family is the base unit of all civilization, and the relations of *jus* must be first in good order among the family members themselves – from which all good and social order derives. A people with disordered or dismembered "families" will never be able to sustain a true civilization.

Within a family, a child is not a possession or a piece of property. He does not exist for the sake of his parents, rather parents exist for the nurturing and education of the child. Children do not exist for the sake of adults; adults exist for them. Each generation is meant to be a source of life and bring the next generation of human beings into existence. It is disappointing that today so many people approach "having a child" as if it were a decision similar to when one might decide to buy a house, begin a 401(k), or buy a dog. This commodification of human life, and its corollary "vision", has brought about a degradation of private, family, and social life. We act according to our principles, and principles are set by purpose and goal. If children are seen as serving the whims of adults, for whatever reason, then the whole family structure is inverted.

The fundamental beauty of human creation is that a man and a woman⁵ are given the possibility of participating with the Creator in the appearance of another human being on the earth. Children are not possessions of the parents, nor do they belong to the State; they are not organs of the mother's body, nor are they disposable parts in her "health care". Children do not belong to the parents, nor are they forms of entertainment for the pleasure of adults.

immature for many years, it is only within a stable and nurturing relationship (usually decades-long) that a predictable, constant, and partnered effort can be present to lead and educate the immature infant/child/adolescent to maturity and wisdom. This is "education": to lead from immaturity to maturity. This natural familial bond was elevated by our Lord to the level of a Divine Mystery in which the very union and relationship between the man and the woman becomes a source of service to God, a place of grace and holiness to the couple, and a source of radiant sanctity to their children and the community. A man and woman so "crowned" are both a reflection and an extension of the Divine Mystery of Christ and the Church.

Children are gifts granted to an adult couple as an act of trust and confidence from God, the Source of all life. Children are each uniquely individual persons created in the divine image, who must be respected, cherished, nurtured, loved, and educated into maturity. All this is purely the nature of things – the *natural law* – and does not include the additional considerations proper to Christians. But the order of grace and salvation builds and elevates this natural order.

Anything less than this fundamental approach to the birth and formation of children cheapens human life overall, because it violates the nature of things. The modern view of the child as a type of commodity (something one *acquires* for oneself) has led to the degradation of parents, the dissolution of family life, and the disintegration of social responsibility.

When one begins to consider the reality of easilyobtained abortion in modern society, it must be kept
in mind that *two* people have generated the child.
Bringing children into the world and rearing them
are not something that the mother does alone, with
the father as some type of throwaway accessory.
Fathers are more than sperm donors, regardless of
how they are presented by modern propaganda.

A child, not being property, does not belong to one parent more than to the other. From the moment of her creation, the human child is a unique person and existentially a free being. Each human being, whatever his age, is a creation formed in the *image of God*.

A child is fully human from the first moment of his existence and, as a human person, fully *equal* to his parents. He may be dependent on them and the rest of his family for care and nurturing as he matures, but he is not a possession of the parents. He is certainly not a mere "body part" to be discussed as a share of the "health care" of his mother. To view the child before birth as somehow less than human is both wrong philosophically and morally abhorrent – no matter how often we hear this pronounced in the media.

Until the baby and the child are respected as being fully human, family and society will continue to

crumble (the relationship of *jus* being profoundly wounded). As *Mother Theresa* once stated, "as long as a mother can kill the child in her womb, there will never be peace on earth".

Human parents are also to be considered as equals in the generation of the child. The mother has no superior claim to the infant. Although nurtured in the womb of the mother, the child belongs in no way "more" to the mother than to the father. From the viewpoint of human life's creation, both have an equal say in the life of their child – and equal responsibility!

The modern conversation about a "woman's right to her body" is equally unacceptable as it makes of the child a "thing". The child is not part of a woman's body even though he is nurtured *in* her body. While each person's own organs have all the same genetic code, scientifically, we know today that the child, from the moment of conception, has her own unique genetic code and form, independent from both her mother and her father.

Abortion is not exclusively a "women's issue". Parents are more than just donors of gametes, so the *father* must also be considered in all discussions concerning a child's health (or even in the unfortunate topic of abortion). We should not allow ourselves to be misled by this propaganda tactic of excluding the father.

Family structure, the basic social unit of a community, and family support are central to the abortion question. Human beings are not mere animals, a type of barnyard creature that goes into heat once a year and breeds, dropping offspring, nurturing it for a moment, and then walking away. For this reason, the report in the Morning Sentinel of a 26%-increase of child abuse cases reported⁶ in Maine for last year is horrifying. And even if it may only be the fact that more cases have been accurately reported, the previous years' statistics indicate that abusive households are increasing numerically in our community.

As long as *family*⁷ is not a consciously cherished part of our community, one that is nurtured by society

is what once was known in the Head-of-Falls neighborhood: djidoo, sitoo, parents, children, aunts, uncles, cousins, and, well,

and its laws, we will continue to have the increased frequency of abortion, child abuse, mental illness, and social disintegration. These all too often find their origins in unstable home life and in unhealthy family relations. It is not by chance that the legalization of abortion, the Woodstock generation's public collapse of sexual behavior, and the increase of divorce all arrived contemporaneously in the 1960s and '70s. They are all intertwined in causality and in effect.

We might also add another element to this modern disorientation and upheaval – the prevalence of *artificial contraception*. While this has always infected some families throughout the ages, it became increasingly prevalent and destabilizing to families from the 1930s onward. This we leave for another consideration.

In summary: **Two** parents: male and female; the existential autonomy and **equality** of the human child from conception;

the necessity of the **family's extended support**, and all the other healthy structures for our well-being: these are the fundamentals required for the rearing and education of children. When all or some of these necessary things are missing, one is tempted to get rid of the central "complication": the child. In this way abortion is born.

But the absence or woundedness of these fundamentals are symptoms of much deeper diseases within the human heart.


