### **ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS**

The Church of Christ is a profound Mystery on earth, just as is the Word Incarnate, the Lord Jesus, born as a babe in Bethlehem, and glorified in divinely transcendent splendor at the Right of the Hidden Father. The Latter is the Eternal One descending among us in time and place, while the other is consecrated mankind moving upward to the Hidden One. The Church is a supra-temporal and supra-personal supernatural community that proclaims the Gospel of healing to all mankind from generation to generation until final fulfillment in the Kingdom ending time.

All time has been touched by grace, but this year has been unique in just about every way possible. So it is that at the end of 2020 we are once again

asked to do the exceptional by having **registration be made necessary** for the Masses of **Christmas**.

Also among the changes, we have added a third Mass for Christmas, but it is important that everyone be aware that *reservation of place is necessary*. Anyone who is not already signed up for one or another of the three Christmas Liturgies – 5:00pm, 9:00am, or 11:00am – will **not** be able to enter.

We must also thank those generous souls who have **volunteered to disinfect, clean, and sanitize** the *church pews, missals*, and the *bathrooms* after each Liturgy, preparing it all for the possibility of having a second and even a third Mass within a twenty-four-hour period.

This same disinfecting routine will be required for as long as the pandemic continues. These same actions will be necessary when we try to reestablish a third Mass on Sunday, or for the Holydays, in a Liturgical Vigil.

For those unable to attend on December 25th, do remember that the Liturgy of the Glorious Nativity is *the same at each of the times*, and indeed will be the same also on the *following Sunday*. Everyone needs to spread out and allow the social-distancing asked of us all during these difficult months.

For those who may have had family members who attend only Christmas Mass each year, it is especially important this time around that they be told, and understand, that *the numbers will be limited to those who have already pre-registered and "signed up"* for this year's Christmas Masses. We would not wish to have people disappointed at the door. These lists are full already and places are taken.

Please note that everyone registered has had to sign up *through the* **ushers**; there has been *no phone or email registration*, thus anyone who is not already listed and signed up at this point will not be able to attend on the Day itself of the Holy Nativity.

On a totally unrelated matter, it has been asked often which book might be a good overall view or explanation of the Church/Faith. Of course, the

first answer is the **Catechism**, which lays out comprehensively the principal articles of the Faith along with brief explanations, but for a global view of the Church, the Body of Christ, as it lives and functions in the world there are few books better than **The Spirit of Catholicism** by Fr. Karl Adam. This is a small but detailed, very readable exposé, and an outstanding explication of the Catholic Church. It is excellent in the manner that it covers so many aspects of the divine life of grace - the Christic-life given to men - especially as this life is expressed in the apparent dilemmas of authority/freedom, community/individual, and in the dynamics of grace/sin that necessarily belong to the living Church of God as she exists here and now.

For Catholics, and for those who might be interested in the Faith, this book is an excellent depiction of the Catholic Faith of which we are so proud and whose noble honor we are grateful to bear. In calling us, may the eternal Good One make us also worthy to be transfigured in His Body, the supra-temporal and supra-personal divine reality in which we have been consecrated through faith and Baptism.




# The Life-giving Cross

#### Please, take notice of our present protocols:

- 1.) All Catholics, of whatever Ritual Church, are more than welcome at Saint Joseph. We are all one Body of Christ.
- 2.) During this pandemic, there is no obligation to assist at the Divine Sacrifice.
- 3.) Those who are sick, or carry symptoms of sickness, must remain at home.
- 4.) All are recommended to give contact information (a list is provided at the door) in order to inform you if need arise from a case of the virus.
- 5.) All vulnerable, elderly, and at-risk individuals should remain at home and follow the Liturgies as posted on the parish's website.
- 6.) The **Vigil** Masses are <u>suspended</u> until further notice.
- 7.) All who are retired, or who may have a freer weekday schedule, are asked to consider assisting at Mass during the weekdays, **Tues-Fri**, 9:00am; and on **Saturday at 10:00am**.
- 8.) Everyone is asked to wear a face-mask.
- 9.) Hand sanitizers are available at the entrances and at the confessional.
- 10.) Seating at church must be "*first-come-first-served*" and will be closed at "50".
- 11.) Everyone must sit in such a way that there is *no one immediately in front* of them and *no one immediately behind* them. The pews have been blocked off for this purpose.
- 12.) To control crowd flow and bring greater security, **doors** will be **locked** at the beginning of each Liturgy.
- 13.) A *six-foot distancing* is to be observed by those who approach the Divine Altar and wish to receive the Divine Eucharist in **Holy Communion**.
- 14.) And, lastly, at the end of Mass, those who wish **to remain and pray** in the church are welcome to do so, but all others are asked *not to linger and visit within the church*. Please <u>exit through the Appleton Street</u> doorway. If one wishes to visit, please do so outside the church, being *mindful of the proper physical distancing*.



#### December 15-23<sup>rd</sup> inclusively

As we were reminded by our Patriarch in his recent Lenten Letter, it is our tradition to fast in preparation for the great feasts, and all are encouraged to do so faithfully, *par*. 25:

This fast is known as "The Fast of the Nativity", during which the faithful abstain from eating meat, dairy products, and eggs, from **December** 16<sup>th</sup> and ends **December** 24<sup>th</sup>.

NB for the faithful in the USA, who celebrate Christmas Eve much as Christmas, the dates are  $15^{th}$ - $23^{rd}$  December inclusively.

We are reminded in *paragraph* 21 of the same letter that "a fast" is **to go without all foods from midnight to noon**, after which we abstain from animal flesh and almost all animal products – this is most similar to a "vegan" diet as one would call it these days.

When a fast day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday (as will be the case this year on December 19-20<sup>th</sup>) one can eat as they wish throughout the day, but should still abstain from all animal flesh and animal products.

These observances are **for all who have** attained the age of the use of reason, *par*. 22.
