Now I myself, Paul, urge you through the gentleness and clemency of Christ – I who am lowly when face to face with you, but brave toward you when absent – I ask that when I am present I need not show boldness by daring to oppose those who think we are acting according to the flesh.

For, although we are in the flesh, we do not battle according to the flesh, for the weapons of our battle are not flesh but are enormously powerful, capable of destroying fortresses.

We destroy arguments and every pretension raising itself against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive in obedience to Christ, and we are ready to punish every disobedience, once your obedience is complete.

Look at what confronts you. Whoever is confident of belonging to Christ should consider that as he belongs to Christ, so do we.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

The *rule* of all virtue will be the imitation of the charity of God, such as it is reflected in the life of His beloved Son.

Mind and spirit: these are the bases upon which grace flourishes. Teachings and the Gospel are only intelligent guideposts; the true work of redemption lies in the collaboration with grace. As Saint Paul reminds us, we may live in this world but the instruments of our struggle are not worldly but transcendent, we are penetrated by the power of the Omnipotent One. For the same reasons our Christian lives are both difficult² and guaranteed to succeed if only we embrace the Light.

The closer we enter into life-giving union with our Lord, the better we introduce the understanding of His ways (mind) and His redemptive grace (spirit and body) into our lives. Prayer is of course one of these contact points – and the one most available every day to each of us – while the Divine Mysteries are the irreplaceable, fundamental and necessary path to divine knowledge. Baptism, Chrismation, Penance, and Eucharist are all required for one to imitate the love of God as it has been shown to us in the life of His Beloved Son.

Great IQ is not required, but docility is, and effort even more so. Moments of quiet and reflection are vitally essential to hearing the divine Voice. Hopefully, we have acquired a greater discipline for silence over these last weeks, a deeper spirit of prayer, and with even greater hope we desire this disposition to remain with us well beyond the celebration of Peschoh.

God will not transform us without us. We note that illuminative grace crushes our illusions and destroys the worldly pretension thrown up by those around us, those facile arguments with which the world

thinks itself so clever. Both inwardly and outwardly the Christian life is lived, or it is not lived at all. When we do not live fully the life of grace we die spiritually. No longer living, mortally wounded by sin, negligent of grace and the Gospel, that person enters death already dead.

Let us be among the living: grace-filled, beloved, ascetic and reciprocating in the love of divine charity.

directors in Planned Parenthood who came to understand that the "fetus" is as much a baby as the one you have carried in your arms.

Although the drama that surrounds an unexpected pregnancy can be horrendous, and the circumstances warrant individual considerations and serious application to correct socially and financially – and all these corrections must be inspired by supernatural faith and charity – we also know from the writings of Saint Paul that God's revelation clarifies the great philosophical question about goals: the "end does <u>not</u> justify the means".³ Situations are not more important than an innocent human life.

This movie, **UNPLANNED**, is the inspiring true story of one woman's journey of transformation. All Abby Johnson ever wanted to do was help women. As one of the youngest Planned Parenthood clinic directors in the nation, she was involved thousands of abortions. Her passion surrounding a woman's "right to choose" even led her to become a spokesperson for Planned Parenthood, fighting to enact legislation for the cause she so deeply believed in until the day she saw something that changed everything, leading her to join her former enemies at 40 Days-For-Life, and become one of the most ardent pro-life speakers in America.

In consideration of the grave difficulties surrounding "'unwanted' pregnancy" – such as the modern collapse of family structure and loss of communal support that once assisted the healthy entrance of babies into the world – we must ever repeat: the baby in question is not the central "problem" and its destruction is not an acceptable "solution". The "termination" of a baby *in utero* is intrinsically evil, completely unacceptable, and a perverse means toward what would then necessarily become a questionable end.

As some seem confused about this, it is essential to repeat that abortion, the deliberate killing of an unborn child, is *gravely sinful* and remains even

today a sin that is cause for excommunication ipso facto from the Church.

Excommunication means that the guilty person is severed from the life of the Catholic Church and can no longer receive the Sacraments or its intercessions until such time as the sin is confessed, properly absolved, and penance is received.

Grave turmoil weighing on the parents -- whether of familial collapse, poverty, health, or the inability to rear this specific child - are all *settings* surrounding the life of the child in question. They are *circumstances*, and as such they do not outweigh the intrinsic value of a human life. The considerations may be serious, and they should be dealt with in charitable and fitting ways, but the death of an innocent can *never* be chosen as means to an end.

All of us should be clear on the gravity of this sin, and the severe penalty imposed on it by the Church. One cannot in good conscience be both a good.

Church. One *cannot in good conscience* be both a good Christian and *support the killing* of the unborn. A Catholic cannot be what is called "pro-choice".



Specifics for the Great fast

as directed by the Patriarch

- A.) Ash Monday and the First Week of Great
 Lent and Great Week of the Passion and
 especially Great and Holy Friday of the
 Crucifixion through to noon on Saturday are
 Days of Fast and Abstinence for all 18-60.
- B.) All from the age of reason onward are obliged to follow the abstinence from all meat products on these fast days even if they are strictly not obliged to fast. On all other weekdays, Monday-Friday, one is encouraged to observe the ancient traditions and fasts.
- C.) All Fridays throughout the year are required days of fast and abstinence from all meat and animal products.

QUANTITY: In our tradition, the fast means no food whatsoever between midnight and noon, only water and medication are permitted. Following noon, only one meal proper is eaten within the next twelve hours, although a second "collation", a "snack", during the remaining time is permitted to sustain strength (this is the equivalent of about two/three ounces of food).

<u>QUALITY</u>: Also, in our eastern tradition, the days of fast are in practice <u>vegan</u>, that is, no animal products, no meat, no seafood, no meat products, no dairy, no eggs, nor dairy products are to be eaten.
