

TOÓAY'S EDISTLE Philipians 1: 1-13

It is right that I should think this way about all of you, because I hold you in my heart, you who are all partners with me in grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the affection of *Msheeho Yeshua*.

And this is my prayer, that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the Day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through *Yeshua Msheeho* for the glory and praise of God.

I wish you to know, brethren, that my situation has turned out rather to advance the gospel, so that my imprisonment has become well-known in *Msheeho* throughout the whole praetorium and to all the rest.



ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

The New Law, for Law there is, is first and foremost the Person of Christ, His Doctrine, and His life itself, which teach us to live as children of God. It is more concretely the Holy Spirit Whom He sends to us and Who suggests to us from within the mentality and the morality of children of God.¹

Who doesn't like a party? Human beings get in line and gather with others in celebration without always knowing what they are doing. Play now, ask later.

Exuberance: it's the spirit of the crowds meeting Our Lord outside of Bethphage. The feeling is understandable; this is the great Rabbi of Nazareth, Miracle-Worker, Compassionate, but curiosity is also a motive among the crowds. This is the One Who raised Lazarus from the dead just a few weeks beforehand. They come to see it all. *Curiosity*. This is the Man Whom the authorities wish to arrest. *Curiosity*. Any way, it's a party, so join the crowd! *Hosanna*! How quickly that jubilation will give way to shouts of "Crucify Him!" in a few days' time.

We know that the Gospel tells us that in the midst of this exuberance Our Lord wept. He knew what was in the heart of man.² Being God, he could clearly see that for most among these crowds the inner heart and the outer actions were not the same.³ This is the path of Great Lent as we collaborate with grace to become fully integrated both within and without, a whole person with integrity. For many in these crowds, the reality within their minds did not correspond with the outward jubilation, and this disharmony would be echoed in the coming destruction of the Holy City.

The whole purpose of Our Lord's mission was to restore that supernatural love to creation which had been lost through the ingratitude of Adam and Eve. Love is the *rule* of the Gospel; and, yes, there is a "law" in the Gospel (the product did come with instructions). It would be so easy if it were otherwise, but true love does not consist vague feelings and sentimentality.

Love, as Scripture says, is as strong as death and a blazing fire.⁴ It has purpose, strength and perseverance. Grace is present to reorient our spirits and hearts to God Incarnate and to attach us completely to the Person of Christ, *Msheeho* – the New Law Incarnate. Committed to this Person we become open to His teaching and His life; we become docile to the working of the Divine Spirit within us. Love brings subtlety and keen attention to the Hidden God of power and might. Love transforms us because it is a true power from the Hidden Good One, and not mere "feelings" originating from within us. Charity moves us from being curious spectators to engaged lovers.

And *our* heart? The things we treasure point to its place. The path to heaven is not possessions or pleasure, this we already know, but in a *Person*: the Way, the Truth and the Life. Our "hosannas" must be more than once or twice a year, lest we, too, be only curiosity seekers inspired by self-interest.

Where lie our hearts and to what are they attracted?

UNPLANNED

the Movie

Bishop Gregory has asked all the parishes to put notice in our bulletins of a new film that has come out. It covers the experience of one of the principal directors in Planned Parenthood who came to understand that the "fetus" is as much a baby as the one you have carried in your arms.

Although the drama that surrounds an unexpected pregnancy can be horrendous, and the circumstances warrant individual considerations and serious application to correct socially and financially – and all these corrections must be inspired by supernatural faith and charity – we also know from the writings of Saint Paul that God's revelation clarifies the great philosophical question about goals: the "end does <u>not</u> justify the means".⁵ Situations are not more important than an innocent human life. This movie, **UNPLANNED**, is the inspiring true story of one woman's journey of transformation. All Abby Johnson ever wanted to do was help women. As one of the youngest Planned Parenthood clinic directors in the nation, she was involved thousands of abortions. Her passion surrounding a woman's "right to choose" even led her to become a spokesperson for Planned Parenthood, fighting to enact legislation for the cause she so deeply believed in until the day she saw something that changed everything, leading her to join her former enemies at 40 Days-For-Life, and become one of the most ardent pro-life speakers in America.

In consideration of the grave difficulties surrounding "'unwanted' pregnancy" – such as the modern collapse of family structure and loss of communal support that once assisted the healthy entrance of babies into the world – we must ever repeat: the baby in question is not the central "problem" and its destruction is not an acceptable "solution". The "termination" of a baby *in utero* is intrinsically evil, completely unacceptable, and a perverse means toward what would then necessarily become a questionable end.

As some seem confused about this, it is essential to repeat that abortion, the deliberate killing of an unborn child, is *gravely sinful* and remains even today a sin that is cause for *excommunication ipso facto* from the Church.

Excommunication means that the guilty person is *severed from the life* of the Catholic Church and *can no longer receive the Sacraments or its intercessions* until such time as the sin is **confessed**, properly **absolved**, and **penance** is received.

Grave turmoil weighing on the parents -- whether of familial collapse, poverty, health, or the inability to rear this specific child – are all *settings* surrounding the life of the child in question. They are *circumstances*, and as such they do not outweigh the intrinsic value of a human life. The considerations may be serious, and they should be dealt with in charitable and fitting ways, but the death of an innocent can *never* be chosen as means to an end.

All of us should be clear on the gravity of this sin, and the severe penalty imposed on it by the

Church. One *cannot in good conscience* be both a good Christian and *support the killing* of the unborn. A Catholic cannot be what is called "pro-choice".



Specifics for the Great fast

as directed by the Patriarch

- A.) <u>Ash Monday and the First Week of Great</u> <u>Lent</u> and <u>Great Week of the Passion</u> and especially <u>Great and Holy Friday of the</u> <u>Crucifixion through to noon on Saturday</u> are *Days of Fast and Abstinence for all.*
- B.) All from the age of reason onward are obliged to follow the abstinence from all meat and animal products on these fast days even if they are strictly not obliged to fast.
- C.) <u>All Fridays throughout the year</u> are required days of fast and abstinence from all meat and animal products. *Exceptions made for the feastdays listed in the Patriarch's Letter.*

QUANTITY: In our tradition, the fast means no food whatsoever between midnight and noon, only water and medication are permitted. Following noon, only one meal proper is eaten within the next twelve hours, although a second "collation", a "snack", during the remaining time is permitted to sustain strength (this is the equivalent of about two/three ounces of food).

QUALITY: Also, in our eastern tradition, the days of fast are in practice <u>vegan</u>, that is, no animal products, no meat, no seafood, no meat products, no dairy, no eggs, nor dairy products are to be eaten.


