TOÓλY'S GOSPEL¹ St. Luke 4: 14-21

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about Him went out into all the surrounding country.

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

A child is not a possession or a piece of property. He does not exist for the sake of the parents, rather parents exist for the nurturing and education of the child. Children do not exist for the sake of adults; adults exist for the sake of bringing a new generation of human beings into existence. It is disappointing that today so many people approach "having a child" as if it were a decision similar to when one might decide to buy a house, begin a 401(k), or buy a dog. It is this type of "vision" that has brought about all too often the degradation of family and social life. We act according to our goals, and if children are seen serving the purposes of adults, for whatever reason, then the whole family structure is inverted.

The fundamental beauty of human creation is that a man and a woman⁴ are given the possibility of participating with the Creator of all in the appearance of another human being on the earth. Children are not possessions of the parents, nor do

they belong to the State; they are not organs of the mother's womb, nor disposable parts in her "health care"; they are not possessions of the parents, nor forms of entertainment for the pleasure of adults. Children are gifts granted to an adult couple as an act of trust and confidence from God, the Source of all life. They are each uniquely individual persons created in the divine image, who must be respected, cherished, nurtured, loved, and educated into maturity.

Note that all this is purely the nature of things – the *natural law* – and does not include the additional considerations proper to Christians. Nevertheless, anything less than this fundamental approach to the birth and formation of children cheapens human life overall, because it violates the nature of things. The modern view of the child as a type of commodity (something one does for oneself) has led to the degradation of parents, the dissolution of family life, and the disintegration of social responsibility.

When we consider the reality of easily-obtained abortion in modern society it must first be kept in mind that *two* people have generated the child. Bring children into the world and rearing them are not essentially something that the mother does with the father as some type of throwaway accessory. Fathers are more than sperm donors, regardless of what is presented by modern propaganda.

The child is not the property of either parent, and he does not "belong" to either of them. From the moment of his creation, the human child is a unique person and existentially a free being – from the point of view of his creation as the *image of God*, the child is fully human from the first moment of his existence and fully *equal* to his parents. He may be dependent on them and the rest of his family for care and nurturing as he matures, but he is not a possession of the parents. He is certainly not a mere "body part" to be discussed as a share of the "health care" of his mother. To view the child before birth as somehow less than human is both wrong philosophically and

partnered effort be present to lead and educate the immature human being/child/adolescent to maturity and wisdom. This natural bond was elevated by our Lord to the level of a Divine Mystery where the very union and relationship between the man and the woman becomes a source of honor to God, and a place of holiness to the couple, and a source of radiant sanctity to their children and the community.

Because the human offspring remain helpless and immature for so many years, it is only in a stable relationship (usually decades-long) that a predictable, constant, and

morally abhorrent - no matter how often we hear this pronounced in the media.

Until the baby (before and after birth) and the child are respected as being fully human, family and society will continue to crumble. As Mother Theresa once stated, "as long as a mother can kill the child in her womb, there will never be peace on earth".

Human parents are also to be considered as equals in the generation of the child. The mother has no superior claim to the infant. Although nurtured in the womb of the mother, the child belongs in no way "more" to the mother than to the father. From the viewpoint of human life's creation, both have an equal say in the life of their child - and equal responsibility!

The modern conversation about a "woman's right to her body" is equally unacceptable as it makes of the child a "thing". The child is not part of a woman's body even though he is nurtured *in* her body. While each person's own organs have all the same genetic plan, scientifically, we know today that the child, from the moment of conception, has his own unique genetic code and form, independent from both the mother and the father.

There are two parents involved in the creation of a human child. As parents are more than just donors of gametes, the *father* must also be considered in all discussions concerning abortion. It is not exclusively a "women's issue". We should not allow ourselves to be misled by this propaganda tactic.

Family structure and *family support* are central to the abortion question. Human beings are not mere animals, a type of barnyard creature that goes into heat once a year and breeds, dropping offspring, nurturing it for a moment, and then walking away. For this reason, the report in the *Morning Sentinel* of a 26%-increase of child abuse cases reported⁵ in Maine for last year is horrifying. And even if it may only be the fact that more cases have been accurately reported, the previous years' statistics indicate that abusive households are increasing numerically in our community.

The *basic social unit* of a community is the family. As long as *family*⁶ is not a consciously cherished part of our community, one that is nurtured by society and its laws, we will continue to have the increased frequency of abortion, child abuse, mental illness, and social disintegration; all these so often find their origins in unstable home life and in unhealthy family relations.

It is not by chance that the legalization of abortion, the Woodstock generation's public collapse of sexual behavior, and the increase of divorce all arrived contemporaneously in the 1960s and '70s. They are all intertwined in causality and in effect.

We might also add another element to this modern disorientation and upheaval - the prevalence of artificial contraception. While this has always infected some families throughout the ages, it became increasingly prevalent and destabilizing to families from the 1930s onward. This we leave for another consideration.

Two parents: male and female;

the existential autonomy and equality of the human child from conception;

the necessity of the family's extended support, and all the other healthy structures for our well-being -these are the fundamental and minimal things required for the rearing and education of children. When all or some of these necessary things are missing, one is tempted to get rid of the central "complication": the child. In this way abortion is born.

The absence of these things are all symptoms of much deeper diseases within the human heart.

As we were reminded by our Patriarch in his recent Lenten Letter, it is our tradition to fast in preparation for the great feasts, and all are encouraged to do so faithfully, *par*. 24:

This fast is known as "The Fast of the Virgin", during which the faithful abstain from eating meat, dairy products, and eggs, from August 7th until August 14th inclusively.

We are reminded in *paragraph* 21 of the same letter that "a fast" is to go without all foods from midnight to noon, after which we abstain from all animal flesh and animal products – this is most similar to a "vegan" diet as one would call it these days.

When a fast day falls on a Saturday or a Sunday (as will be the case on August 10th and 11th this year) one can eat as they wish, but should still abstain from all animal flesh and animal products.

These observances are for all who have attained the age of the use of reason, *par*. 22.
