Saint James 3: 13-18

ABOUNA'S REFLECTIONS

From the fairest daughter of man, God clothed Himself with the form of a man in the splendor of perfection.²

Male and female are the two aspects of the one nature of the human creature³ made in the image of the Word of God Incarnate. Within the Divine Economy in the redemption and restoration of mankind, Mary of Nazareth is the unique creation who touches the very boundaries of Divinity through her participation in that act of Incarnation. Saint Ephraim called her the "ship bearing treasures" through this world, whose "cargo" is the Divine Son of the Hidden Father. She is, he also calls her, the sacred Vine that brought forth the "Cluster of Fire".

Maryam is the restoration of *woman* in the New Creation and she is thus the exemplar of all womanhood as it was intended to be from all eternity in the Divine Mind. Mary is to the world what Eve was meant to have been if not for the tragedy of Eden. One mother brought wounds and death, while the latter brought forth healing. The Hidden One Himself fulfilled the restoration of *masculinity* as the *New Adam*, in Whom we each find redemption into life eternal.

The Blessed Virgin is the *New Eve*, restored womanhood, the Immaculate⁴ Virgin, perfect daughter of creation, docile instrument of the Spirit of Holiness, Mother of the Word Incarnate, Co-

Redemptrix, Mother of Sorrows, unshaken Faithful One, Mother of the Light; she was assumed into Heaven, and in splendor she is now the Mediatrix of all graces. At the right of her glorious Son, she is the Mother of the Church and holds sway over the Mystical Body of Christ and all creation.

Intact, integral, whole, and virginal, Mary responded freely, and in every moment, to the luminous embrace of grace, fulfilled the promises made to Abraham and the Patriarchs; she was recipient of the prophecies made to Israel and Judea; she was manifestly the fulfilment of the "Daughter of Zion", and, among the *anawim*,⁵ in her humility, she collaborated with the initiative of the Good One to bring healing to the human race made possible by the appearance of the Eternal Word among us. From that day forward she has shown compassion and aid to all the fallen children of Eve. Her desire has been, and is, to heal, raise up, and re-integrate the children of Adam into the New Adam, in Whose Body we are uniquely saved.

In a small place and relative to all this, although it is great in itself, is the fact that she is Queen and Protector of the Lebanon, the mystic white mountains spoken of eloquently in the Sacred Scriptures. She is Queen of the nation that has grown up in the shadow of their presence.

Pray that this merciful Lady intercede and guide the wounded and suffering among us, and under her title as Protector of Lebanon that she might heal the turmoil of that country and region which is so much in need of her now.
